Community Forums coming Washington County to discuss the vision for people with intellectual and developmental disabilities – November 9 and 10

The Office of Developmental Disability Services (ODDS) is hosting two Community Forums in Hillsboro to discuss the vision for the future of services for people with intellectual and developmental disabilities. Ensuring the principles of self-determination is the core of our vision.

Who: People with intellectual and developmental disabilities who receive services and their families, as well as providers, Community Developmental Disability Programs (CDDPs) and Support Service Brokerages are encouraged to attend. (Brokerages provide services to eligible adults living in their own or their family's home to help them remain in their homes and be engaged in their communities.)

- For people with intellectual and developmental disabilities who receive services and their families: Monday, November 9, from 6 - 8 p.m. at the Washington County Public Services Building, Auditorium, 155 N. First Ave, Hillsboro.
- For CDDPs, brokerages and providers: November 10, from 9 a.m. to noon at the Washington County Public Services Building, Cafeteria, 155 N First Ave, Hillsboro.

What: There will be a short presentation followed by a group discussion. This is one in a series of Community Forums throughout the state.
