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## **Recruitment event for homecare and personal support workers coming to Hermiston Monday -- morning and evening sessions planned**

Two recruitment events are planned for Monday, November 16 in Hermiston for homecare and personal support workers. The events will be held at the Best Western Inn, 2255 Highway 395 South Hermiston.

“There is a greater need for workers as the senior population in Oregon increases, new regulations related to the Fair Labor Standards Act are implemented, and the number of children eligible for services under the K-Plan increases. One of the goals of the Oregon Home Care Commission is to attract a committed and diverse homecare workforce to meet the specific needs of Oregonians who are seniors and people with disabilities who are eligible for Medicaid or OPI services and supports in and outside of the home.

Individuals who successfully complete the application and enrollment process will have access to the Oregon Home Care Commission’s Registry and may appear on referral lists for consumers and families looking for a homecare or personal support workers throughout Oregon. They also have the ability to search Registry Help Wanted Ads in their communities posted by consumers and families,” Cheryl M. Miller, Oregon Home Care Commission Executive Director, said.

Homecare workers provide in-home services for seniors and adults with physical disabilities eligible for publicly funded in-home programs. A personal support worker provides services and supports in and outside of the home for children and adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities and also for adults with mental illness.

Some of the qualifications for these careers include: good communication skills; attention to detail; flexibility; problem solving skills; respect for others; ability to follow directions; and a passion for helping people.

Some of the benefits of being a homecare or personal support worker include: paid time off; health insurance; Worker's Compensation; paid trainings; and opportunities for advancement.

The recruitment events will cover provider application and enrollment agreements; background check sessions, SEIU (Service Employees International Union) presentations; new worker orientations for homecare and personal support workers.

The morning session is from 8 a.m. to noon. The afternoon session is from 1 to 5 p.m. The same material will be covered in each session.
