

## CMS/LTC Study Group

### Required Outcomes:

According to the 1115(a) waiver accountability plan, this is an exploratory stakeholder process that will result in a report to CMS regarding the integration of DHS Medicaid-funded long-term care for the aged or people with disabilities into CCO global budgets. The report will identify:

- Opportunities
- Barriers
- Strategies for integrating long term care

The report will address:

- Issues of scope
- Process
- Timeline for integration

The report will be submitted to CMS no later than December 31, 2013. The final recommendations of the report are not predetermined and will re-define integration and how it applies to Oregon.

Additional Outcomes: Recommendations from the study group shall inform future work of OHA and DHS.

### Meeting Outline:

The CMS/LTC Study Group will meet once a month for 6 months, starting in May 2013. The 6 meetings will include the following categories of work:

- Orientation- session 1

- Current state Oregon w/ discussion of barriers and opportunities
- Design- sessions 2-3
  - Other state models w/ discussion of potential Oregon overlay
  - Shared accountability- metrics and financial incentives
- Potential models- session 4
  - Using elements of promising models from session 2
  - Current Oregon shared accountability model
- Process and timeline- session 5
  - Draft- high level plan w/ key processes and milestones
- Evaluation and final recommendations- session 6
  - Final Report
  - Review Shared Accountability recommendations

The following overarching themes will be used to organize the contents of the study group sessions:

- Data driven, transparent and outcome oriented
- Consumer centered with a focus on access and equity
- Learning from other state's experience
- Potential for Oregon overlay
