## Need to dispose of old pesticides?

- **COST: FREE**
- **Safely and anonymously** dispose of old and unusable pesticides on April 28th 2016.
- **Agricultural, forestry and commercial waste pesticides** in the mid and southern Willamette Valley and Oregon Coast Range will be accepted.
- **Using a confidential system, you must pre-register** with the disposal service so they can prepare to receive the chemicals. To register, contact Clean Harbors or access it on **OSU Extension's** web page: <http://extension.oregonstate.edu/benton/>
- Obtain, complete and submit your registration to Clean Harbors Environmental Services. You must register by April

## Have empty pesticide containers to recycle?

- **COST: FREE**
- **Recycle** clean, dirt and residue free, triple-rinsed plastic containers. For triple rinse procedures, see the Ag Container Recycling Council website at <http://www.acrecycle.org> and select the link for Container Rinsing.
- **Containers up to 55-gallon** capacity plastic drums will be accepted. Containers need to be made from high density polyethylene (HDPE) and embossed with recycling symbol #2.
- **No pre-registration needed** to recycle triple-rinsed pesticide containers.

A wide variety of pesticides are applied and held in storage in many parts of Oregon. Old and unused pesticides can accidentally enter waterways through leaching, flooding, or runoff. Chemicals collected from this area are properly disposed of and eliminated as future threats to water quality. This is an opportunity for landowners and other commercial pesticide users to remove, free of charge, unwanted materials.

Help protect your water, air, and soil by bringing your old and unused pesticides to this free collection event for proper disposal.
