As a longtime North Portland resident, I recognize the importance of safe and usable access to jobs, neighborhoods and nature. Where we once had easy access to the west end of the peninsula, we now face barriers in the form of high volume, high speed car and freight traffic across multi lane roads with no safe crossings for long stretches.


As we work to move away from the single occupant car, as costs of driving escalate as wages stagnate, as integrating physical activity into our daily lives becomes more important, the North Portland Willamette Greenway Trail become more important also. And a separated grade crossing at N Columbia Blvd will help promote more active transportation and remove the burden an at-grade crosswalk would impose upon industry and transportation.

As former Chairman of the St Johns Neighborhood Association, as a member of npGreenway core group, through participation in the 2030 Bicycle Master Plan Steering Committee and the Smith and Bybee Lakes Trail Alignment Study, I understand the importance of active transportation, the benefits of 'one less car' to the environment, health and commerce. Investment in safe facilities will encourage and promote workers in Rivergate to leave their cars home, as well as people looking to explore Smith and Bybee Lakes and Kelley Point and on to Marine Drive.

The N Portland Willamette Greenway Trail is not envisioned as a recreational trail, rather a trail that connects neighborhoods to jobs, commerce and nature. Lack of safe facilities will hinder that goal, as well as slow commerce on N Columbia. There are other grant opportunities available to actually construct the overpass. However, having the study completed expedites the process and allows Metro and the City of Portland to leverage the investment from STIP funding to reach the goal of actual construction.

Funding this study and the trail to Kelley Point will pay dividends for the next century, and improve overall movement of traffic as well.

To Whom It May Concern:

I am writing to encourage passage of the grant application for funds to build this segment of the North Portland Greenway Trail (Willamette Greenway Trail). This segment of the trail is the only segment of the five segment of the North Portland Greenway Trail that is completely ready and available for construction to begin. There are no private parcels to interrupt the continuity of the trail alignment, with the entire segment being in public ownership.

Critical to the creation of a safe, efficient and inviting -- and thereby successful -- recreational and commuter piece of transpiration infrastructure will be the construction of an overpass at Columbia Blvd and Chimney Park. An at-grade crossing will bring bicyclers and hikers to a halt; will repeatedly inconvenience and frustrate an otherwise enjoyable and rewarding trail experience; and, will bring about all the necessary ingredients for a possible tragedy. For the freight community, which is participating in the attempt to streamline freight traffic away from some habitual routes through residential parts of St. Johns, an at-grade trail crossing Columbia Blvd. is bound to foster resentment -- especially at this location where trucks are trying to build speed for an upcoming incline or accelerating down that incline in the other direction heading for a long clear stretch before the entrance to Rivergate.

For these reasons, all of us who have been longing for this trail and who want it to be the best trail experience for everyone -- we are very hopeful that this grant will be accepted.

Dear Metro Council:

As the committee charged with overseeing the expenditure of the remaining balance contained in the North Portland Enhancement Fund, we support using a substantial portion of this fund for development of the North Portland Greenway Trail. As you know, the fund was started to offset the impacts caused by the St. Johns Landfill to the neighborhoods in North Portland. The committee believes that there are few expenditures better suited for this fund than restoring public access to this property, which is now in a prairie-like state and is home to coyotes, bald eagles, and threatened species like the streaked horned lark.

It is our understanding that this commitment creates the opportunity to leverage other grants to fund trail connections to the site, thereby potentially enabling future access to Kelly Point Park, the Smith and Bybee Natural Area, and employment areas like Rivergate. We agree to the following:

- Commit up to \$851,000 of the North Portland Enhancement Fund as a match for the ODOT Statewide Transportation Improvement Program grant process, the USDOT TIGER Discretionary Grant, or other grant opportunities.
- At a minimum, proceeds from the North Portland Enhancement Funds would be used to develop a bridge from Chimney Park across Columbia Boulevard *and* a trail that leads to an overlook point within the former landfill site.
- Funds should be encumbered within the next 4 years. If funds remain unencumbered for trail developments by 2017, they should be returned to the North Portland Enhancement Fund balance.
- Periodic updates on the status of these funding requests should be communicated to the committee.

After decades of use as a city dump, opening access and recreating this land into a celebrated resource is a tremendous opportunity and a legacy worth leaving to future North Portland residents.

I'm writing to express my support for the proposed Enhance project E60- Willamette Greenway Trail: Chimney Park to Kelley Point Park. I am a North Portland resident and while not a die-hard cyclist, I do enjoy bicycling for exercise and recreation, and commuting when my work location allows. Before I found out about this proposed project I had ridden to Kelley Point Park several times, but almost always on a Sunday when the truck traffic was reduced. I have felt the extreme nerves and great caution of crossing N. Columbia Blvd. without adequate bike/pedestrian routes, and of riding along a main road when a semi-truck comes up behind me. I'm a cautious rider, but still have felt like the existing system is an accident waiting to happen, if it hasn't already. I've thought it such a shame that the fantastic natural areas of Smith and Bybee Lakes and Kelley Point Park so close to St. Johns and the rest of the city that there is not good bike access -- such a deterrent for families or more timid riders than I to reach those destinations on two wheels rather than four, if at all.

I was therefore delighted to learn about the proposed enhancements. A proper crossing over Columbia Blvd. would alone do wonders, but I am very happy to see that the proposal also includes better connections to viewpoints and more smooth connections to other trail segments. My husband and I also own businesses in North Portland, and I also support this proposal from that perspective. While I don't know that our business would be directly impacted, I do believe that enhancing the route and accessibility in general has great potential to draw more cyclists through St. Johns and neighboring areas. They may stop for coffee or a bite to eat or a beer afterwards, and may peruse local shops along the way, just as I have stopped in Sellwood en route to the Johnson Creek trail. This proposal therefore has the potential to have ripple effects throughout the community that are positive for support of our natural areas, local businesses, and community development.

On behalf of the City of Portland Pedestrian Advisory Committee (PAC), I am writing in support of multiple ODOT STIP Enhance Program project applications on the 150% Project List submitted by the City of Portland and other agencies. - E21 Connected Cully (\$ 2,877,641)
- E22 Downtown I-405 Pedestrian Safety and Operational Improvements (\$ 2,009,952)

In addition, the PAC supports the following projects, but to a lesser extent:

- E23 N Broadway Safety Crossing Enhancement Project (\$ 1,389,458)
- E33 Sullivan's Gulch Trail Under crossing of I-205 (\$ 1,555,921)
- E69 I-205 Path at Johnson Creek (\$1,250,000) (ODOT)
- E60 Willamette Greenway Trail: Chimney Park/Kelley Pt Park (\$5,000,000) (Metro)

The PAC would like to see the design of the Sullivan's Gulch Trail Under crossing of I-205 revisited and refined to better serve pedestrians.

I grew up in Gresham and am a long-time resident of east Portland (more than 40 years). I've also been involved, as a citizen, in land use and transportation issues in the area for many years. I'm also a new bike rider (since 2010).

With that in mind, I'd like to advocate for some specific projects on the STIP list.

First, I urge you to move forward the project that will make safety improvements for pedestrians along SE Foster -- **SE Foster Road Safety and Sidewalk Enhancement Project**. Safety improvements are desperately needed along this stretch of Foster to reduce the number of pedestrians killed or injured while trying to cross Foster.

Second, I urge you to give high priority to the **Sullivan's Gulch Trail Undercrossing of I-205**. At this time, it is very difficult & dangerous for residents who live west of the I-205 freeway in this area to access the Gateway Regional Center or the I-205 Multi-Use Path (MUP). This is made more difficult than most freeway crossings because it's also has multiple ramps connecting the I-205 AND I-84 freeways. To get to the MUP, they have to walk over a very steep overpass, with all eastbound and westbound bicycle and pedestrians sharing a single, narrow sidewalk. [Pedestrians and bikes are NOT permitted on the other side of the Halsey overpass because of a freeway off ramp from I-84 to Halsey.] Once they've navigated this treacherous section, they must make their way through the Gateway Shopping Center, through the Gateway Transit Center and across three sets of light-rail tracks to get to the I-205 MUP -- nearly a mile of dangerous travel to reach a path that's less than a quarter mile "as the crow flies". Because of the interchange at this location, pedestrians and cyclists would have to travel about a mile north (around Rocky Butte) to reach the next MUP access -- or travel considerable distance (to 82nd Ave, plus an I-84 crossing at Glisan) to reach the next closest MUP access to the south -- and the intersection where the MUP crosses Glisan is also a safety issue. At first glance this project may seem less significant than most -- but, in fact, it could make a HUGE difference in the area. which is bi-sected by two major interstate highways.

The third project that merits strong support is the **Connected Cully** project. This large, diverse, low-income neighborhood has had only one tiny 2-acre park. Portland Parks has purchased, prepared a Master Plan, and has started developing Cully Park -- but improvements are needed to make it safe for pedestrians and cyclists to get to the new park. These improvements will also

benefit children trying to walk to school.

I am writing to urge you to fund three specific pending applications for STIP-Enhance funding, which I feel will make a major difference in improving bike/pedestrian safety and connectivity in the Portland area:

1) Metro's application for funding for the Willamette Greenway Trail in the Chimney Park/Kelly Point Park area, which would open the St.

Johns Prairie site to the public and fill a critical gap in this trail. I am an active biker and hiker, and I am continually frustrated by the lack of connectivity of the bike/ped trails in Portland, especially North Portland, which has so much potential for longer off-road trails. This project would dramatically increase the connectivity in the area, and provide long-needed linkages, including the Willamette Greenway trail and providing access to a good viewpoint on the former landfill. Thousands of Portland-area bikers and pedestrians will use these new amenities, and it will also be a big step toward completion of the 40-mile Loop.

2) The City of Portland's application for improvements on Columbia/Alderwood/Cully. This is an especially dangerous intersection for bikes, autos, and pedestrians. I use this intersection to go to the airport, and personally have witnessed three near-accidents involving autos and bicycles. This is a desperately needed improvement.

3) The City of Portland's application for the Connected Cully project. I live in a neighborhood adjoining Cully, and our family frequently bikes through Cully. There are major gaps in sidewalks and pavement, and numerous other major impediments to biking and walking through this highly-diverse and low/middle-income neighborhood. I see approving this project as a matter of transportation justice, since Cully has the highest percentage of unpaved roads in the city per square mile.

Please give these 3 projects the highest priority and provide the requesting agencies with all of the requested funding.
