Update: U.S. 30 at Columbia City to stay restricted to one lane until Friday, Oct. 12

Rail crossing project limits U.S. 30 to one lane with flaggers controlling both directions

A Portland & Western Railroad crossing replacement project in Columbia City will restrict U.S. 30 (Lower Columbia River Highway) to one lane with flaggers controlling both directions of traffic until **2 p.m. on Friday, Oct. 12**. The lane closures are at Portland & Western's rail crossing, mile post 32.2, just west of Columbia City.

The work and lane restrictions began on Tuesday, Oct. 9. The lane restriction originally was scheduled to be lifted by 5 p.m. on Thursday, Oct. 11, but additional paving on U.S. 30 is required before the highway can be safely reopened. ODOT maintenance crews have built a temporary lane to the south side of U.S. 30 to handle both directions of traffic at the railroad crossing. Eastbound and westbound motorists on U.S. 30 will be alternately flagged through the temporary roadway until work is completed. Motorists should expect delays.
