

Sunrise Highway Construction: New 82nd Drive Connection Opening

Some traffic changes this summer

Beginning no earlier than July 6, motorists, cyclists, transit riders and business people can expect some traffic changes and delays as a result of the next construction phases of the Sunrise JTA (Jobs and Transportation Act) Project. This work will build the connections from the Milwaukie Expressway to the new Sunrise Highway which will open in 2016.

The detours will change over the summer as the construction progresses. Signs will be posted to direct vehicles, cyclists, transit riders and pedestrians through the detour areas. The project website, www.sunrisejta.org, will be updated regularly with maps illustrating current and expected closures and detours. See inside for details.




PHASE 1 – Permanent Changes



- Milwaukee Expressway eastbound and I-205 southbound access to SE 82nd Drive southbound is closed permanently.
- Take I-205 South to exit 12A (OR 212/224) to travel to SE 82nd Drive.

PHASE 2 – Temporary Changes Approximately 30 days in August or September*



- Milwaukee Expressway eastbound access to I-205 northbound is closed temporarily.
- SE 82nd Drive northbound access to I-205 northbound is closed temporarily.
- Use SE 82nd Avenue northbound to SE Sunnybrook Blvd on-ramp to I-205 north.
- Milwaukee Expressway eastbound and I-205 southbound access to SE 82nd Drive southbound is closed permanently.
- Take I-205 South to exit 12A (OR 212/224) to travel to SE 82nd Drive.

Scheduled for completion in 2016, the purpose of the Sunrise JTA project is to address congestion and safety problems in the OR 212/224 corridor with a new four-lane highway from I-205 to SE 122nd Avenue and improving connections to the Lawnfield Industrial District.

The Sunrise Corridor is an essential freight route from I-5 and I-205 to U.S. 26 and Eastern Oregon. In addition, the Clackamas Industrial Area is home to one of the state's busiest and most important freight distribution centers. The existing OR 212/224 corridor is incapable of handling expected increased demand for community development and industrial expansion in the area. The Sunrise JTA project is expected to reduce congestion, increase safety and enhance economic development and freight mobility.

The new Sunrise JTA highway will:

- Reduce travel times between the Clackamas Industrial District and I-205
- Relieve congestion on OR 212/224, I-205 and SE 82nd Drive
- Divert 20,500 daily trips off the existing road system, reducing annual delays by 920,000 hours
- Provide hundreds of highway construction jobs and support 5,900 existing jobs in the area
- Create long-term employment opportunities through improved freight mobility and a thriving industrial district
