Project location

The project is located on the Oregon Coast Highway, US101, from the OR126 Junction (Florence Eugene Highway) at MP 190.22 to the Douglas County line at MP 198.58.

Project purpose and need

The pavement condition is deteriorating and is in need of repair. The project will place new asphalt the entire length. In the non-curbed sections additional asphalt will be placed over the existing. Throughout the curbed sections, asphalt will be ground out and replaced with new asphalt. ADA ramps and other safety features will be upgraded if needed. It is possible that small amounts of ROW could be needed to construct ADA ramps. If so determined, individual property owners will be contacted to discuss those needs and potential impacts.

At the request of the City of Florence, the feasibility of fitting bike lanes on Hwy 101 throughout the curbed section of town, from OR126 Junction to the bridge, is being examined. The width available is limited. Per City direction, parking spaces will not be eliminated to accommodate the placing of bike lanes.

In two lane sections, both lanes of traffic will share one lane during construction, flagger controlled. Where two lanes in one direction exist, traffic will be restricted to one lane during construction. Weekend lane closures will not be allowed. Work will be restricted on special event days.

Cost estimate

Construction cost estimate is \$4.5M.
