## Lozier Lane Improvements (Medford)



**Problem:**  
Lozier Lane is an urban roadway with rural characteristics. It is a narrow two-lane road with drainage ditches and no bike lane or sidewalks. Pedestrians are at risk walking along the roadway and several have been struck by vehicles.

This would complement improvements made at Ross Lane immediately to the north and complete corridor improvements between Rossanley Drive (Oregon 238) and Stewart Avenue.



### Project Scope:

Widen Lozier Lane to add a continuous left turn lane, bike lanes and sidewalks on both sides of the roadway, curb, gutter, underground storm drainage and street lighting. These improvements are part of both Medford's and Jackson County's Transportation System Plans.

Concurrent to this project, the City also plans to complete the connection of Lozier Lane south of Stewart to connect Cunningham Avenue and Garfield Street, thus connecting both north-south

and east-west corridors in Medford.
