

I-5: Anlauf to Elkhead Road Paving

What is ODOT planning to do?

The section of Interstate 5 between Elkhead Road (milepoint 154.8) and the Anlauf area (milepoint 162.2) was last paved in 1997 and has been repaired multiple times due to normal wear and tear.



In an effort to reduce ongoing maintenance costs, this project will replace the asphalt road surface with concrete.

While asphalt on interstate highways is usually repaved every 10-15 years, concrete is designed to last 50 years.

Construction is scheduled to begin in summer 2015 and continue until mid of 2017.

How will drivers be affected?

Construction will be scheduled so that between Memorial Day and Labor Day there will be no daytime lane closures.

Motorists should expect 24 hour a day lane closures in the 10 weeks after Labor Day and the 10 weeks between spring break and Memorial Day. At other times, motorists should watch for intermittent lane and shoulder closures for barrier and guardrail work.
