# Del Rio Road / Winchester Interchange



## Construction begins in June

The Oregon Department of Transportation will soon replace the Del Rio Road bridge over Interstate 5 at the Winchester Interchange. The bridge replacement provides an opportunity to make other improvements to the interchange.



### What improvements will this project make?

- Shift all four ramps north to provide more acceleration and deceleration space for vehicles entering and exiting I-5.
- Realign Del Rio Road so that it leads directly into Umpqua College Road.
- Create bike lanes and sidewalks on and near the new bridge.
- Install two traffic signals on Highway 99, one at the new Del Rio/Umpqua College Road intersection and the other where the new northbound I-5 ramps meet Highway 99.
- Realign Highway 99 north of the old Winchester Bridge to improve the flow of traffic.
- Relocate the parking lot of the fish viewing area north of the Winchester Bridge to improve safety and to include spaces for disabled drivers, school buses and large vehicles.

### How long will construction continue?

Construction will start in June and will continue until fall 2012. Traffic will remain on the old Del Rio Road and bridge until spring or summer 2012.

### How will this affect traffic?

Generally, all lanes of I-5 will remain open, though some nighttime lane closures will be necessary. Expect lane closures and delays on Highway 99 and Del Rio Road throughout construction. Some temporary ramp closures will be required.
