



Camp Cr. Rock Fall Project

Construction 2016

Sept. 4, 2015

OVERVIEW: The project will excavate two slopes above U.S. Highway 26 near mile post 220 and 220.5 where rock and debris historically fall onto the roadway due to the steep terrain and limited shoulder area for debris collection. The project site is located near Camp Creek Road, approximately 20 miles east of Unity.

PURPOSE AND NEED: Currently there are two hills above the highway that are at a steep slope and continually deposit loose rock onto the highway. The purpose of this project is to excavate the hill sides back, and remove the excess material, to a slope that will prevent any rock falling onto the highway.

CONSTRUCTION IMPACTS: Expect delays of up to 20 minutes and full highway closures at work sites with flaggers or temporary signals controlling traffic during work hours. During non-work hours (including evenings and weekends) travel will be reduced at times to one lane with temporary portable signals controlling traffic through the work zones.



Due to the volume of material to be removed from the hillside, heavy dump truck and other equipment traffic along this route can be expected. **Please plan for extra travel time and watch for trucks, equipment and work crews.**

TIMELINE: The project is expected to go out to bid on November 5, 2015, with work occurring during the 2016 construction season. Work will typically take place during daylight hours Monday through Friday.
