

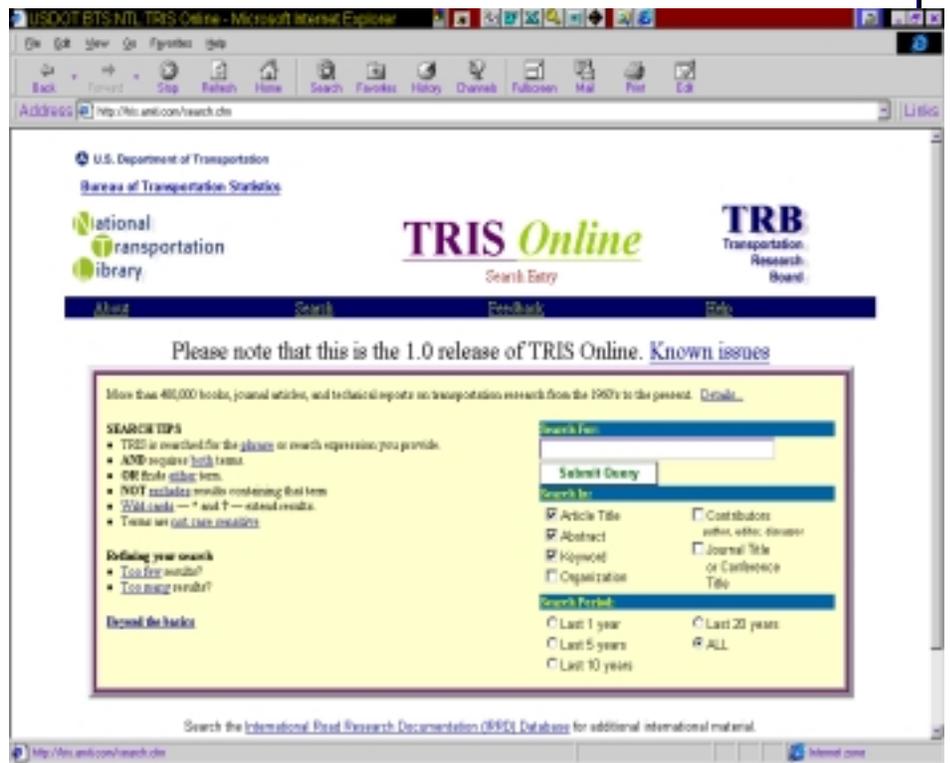
## Information at Your Fingertips!

Ever wonder what the “state of the practice” is in your field of expertise? Now you can use the internet to access research. The Transportation Research Information Service (TRIS) now offers public access to a database of almost half a million records. **TRIS Online** contains references to books, technical reports, conference proceedings, journal articles and on-going research in the field of transportation.

**TRIS Online** includes full-text reports or links to publishers or suppliers of the original documents. You will find titles, publication dates, authors, abstracts, and document sources.

TRIS searches may be as simple or as complicated as you like. For a simple search example, see <http://www.odot.state.or.us/tddresearch/rsnote.htm>. The search tips on the online form (shown at right) can help you target the most useful information.

Each year over 20,000 new records are added to TRIS. The database includes international research as well as research sponsored by the federal and state transportation agencies.
