Conviction Entries	1 of 3

Convictions are recorded when DMV receives notice from a court or another state that the driver has been convicted of violating a motor vehicle law. Convictions are displayed in two different formats:

Oregon Conviction Display Format

This format is used to display convictions which occurred in Oregon.

ACD (out-of-state) Conviction Display Format

This format is used to display convictions received from another state using ACD codes (the standardized codes used to communicate driving record information between states), whether manually entered by Oregon or electronically transmitted from another state.

(a) Displays one of the following:

CONVICTION	The driver has been found guilty of a traffic offense.
SIM CONV	“Simulated” conviction. This segment is NOT based on a court notice. DMV creates this segment in limited circumstances ONLY to comply with CDL/CMV federal reporting requirements.
APPEALD CONV	The driver appealed the conviction after it was entered on the record. If driver loses the appeal, CONVICTION replaces APPEALD CONV. If the driver wins the appeal, field (e) will show VACATED.
AQUITTD CONV	Indicates receipt of a ‘court order of dismissal’ or ‘judgment of acquittal’ on a DUII charge received on or after 9/27/87.

Note: One asterisk following CONVICTION means that it is counted in the Driver Improvement and Habitual Offender Programs as a traffic "violation". Two asterisks following CONVICTION means that it is counted in the Habitual Offender Program as a traffic "crime" (major offense).

(b) Date of offense.

(c) Date of conviction, acquittal, or appealed decision (if decision was against the person).

(d) Type of Offense: Oregon abbreviation or ACD code. Refer to Appendix 2 for definition of Oregon offenses and to Appendix 3 for ACD codes.

(e) Displays one of the following: (Oregon convictions only.)

VACATE	The action has been vacated and has no effect on the person's driving record.
BLANK	Driver found guilty of the offense by the court.
AQ	Offense was acquitted by the court.
AP	Conviction was appealed.
G/D	Driver found guilty by default.
INC	Court sentenced the driver to incarceration.
OLD	Offense is a non-CDL/CMV out-of-state conviction received 180 days or more after the conviction date. No subsequent action, such as a suspension, is taken on convictions with an 'OLD' indicator.

These codes are no longer used but may still appear on some records.

BF	Driver found guilty by bail forfeiture.
MV	Conviction was a moving violation.

(f) Offense type and class (Oregon convictions only).

Types and classes noted in *SUBSCRIPT* text are no longer used.

(g) Internal ID number assigned by DMV to file abstract from the court. This field will display all zeros for some ACD convictions, in this case the conviction record was received electronically and no abstract will be found on microfilm.

(h) Court types: Oregon courts only.

- (i) Court location:
 - If the court name is more than five characters in length, it will be abbreviated (see Appendix 5, for list of court abbreviations).
 - If the offense occurred in another state, the two letter state abbreviation will display.
 - A two letter state abbreviation followed by court type such as “AKCIR” for Alaska Circuit Court or “CAMUN” for California Municipal may also appear in this field for out-of-state convictions transmitted electronically.
 - If the offense is a simulated conviction (SIM CONV), “ORDMV” will display.
- (j) Employment Indicator will display ‘**EMP**’ if the conviction was employment related.
- (k) Commercial Motor Vehicle indicator. This field will display ‘**CMV**’ if the offense involved the operation of a commercial motor vehicle.
- (l) Hazardous Materials Indicator. This field will display ‘**HAZ**’ if the offense involved the transportation of hazardous materials.
- (m) If (d) indicates the offense is V DSG SPD, VBR or S92, the following information displays:

1. The actual speed the person was driving.	
2. The designated or posted speed limit.	

If field (d) indicates the offense is A11, field (m) will display the words “ALCOHOL LEVEL” and give the actual content such as .08% etc.
- (n) State where the driver was convicted if other than Oregon. This appears mostly on ACD entries (a court type may also display in this field with the state abbreviation. (EXAMPLE: CAMUN for California Municipal or AKDIS for Alaska District.)
- (o) Unique ID number (referred to as CID) assigned to conviction to comply with CDL/CMV federal reporting requirements.
- (p) Commercial Driver License holder indicator. This field will display ‘**CDL**’ if the offense was committed by a person who held a CDL at the time of the offense.
- (q) Conviction Incident Indicator. This field will display an asterisk (*) if the offense counts towards a lifetime CDL suspension. If the offense does not count, this field will be blank.
- (r) File locator information supplied by the state where the conviction occurred. This field only appears on ACD conviction entries.
- (s) Additional reference information supplied by the state where the conviction occurred. This field only appears on ACD conviction entries.
- (t) Underlying offense. Displays as the ACD code of the underlying (associated) offense. This field only appears if the conviction (field (d)) is D45, D53, or D56.
