I. CALL TO ORDER AND INTRODUCTIONS

Chair Chuck Hayes called the meeting to order and introductions were made. Chair Hayes asked for a moment of silence in remembrance of the cause of reducing impaired driving related deaths and injuries in Oregon.

II. CHAIR REPORT

Chair Hayes reported on the Medical Marijuana and Marijuana Legalization Impact on DWI Workshop held by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration. Both he and Troy Costales participated in the workshop. Chair Hayes distributed and/or shared the following articles with the Committee:

Chair Hayes asked the Committee and guests if they have seen drivers smoking marijuana and shared his observations. Discussion ensued.

III. MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETINGS

Chair Hayes asked if there were any additions or changes to the June 5, 2015 meeting minutes.

MOTION: Cate Duke moved to approve the June 5, 2015 meeting minutes as submitted. Connie Cabrera seconded the motion. With no further discussion, the motion passed unanimously.

Chair Hayes asked if there were any additions or changes to the July 10, 2015 meeting minutes.

MOTION: Teresa Douglas moved to approve the July 10, 2015 meeting minutes as submitted. Jody Vaughan seconded the motion. With no further discussion, the motion passed unanimously.

IV. TSD REPORT

Dan Estes shared a copy of the Oregon Department of Transportation's 2017 legislative timeline and the Transportation Safety Division's legislative summary for the 2015 legislative session. Some of the dates for the 2017 legislative session overlap with the deadlines that the Committee will need to meet. Mr. Estes reported on the motorcycle safety assessment that was recently conducted. He also shared that the Transportation Safety Division management review conducted by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration went extremely well. The panel finished a day early and only commendations were in the report. He gave a report from the Governor's Highway Safety Association Annual Meeting that he attended on behalf of Mr. Costales. He also reported on the Law Enforcement for Traffic Safety committee meeting that was recently held. He informed the Committee of several new grants that have recently been approved by the Oregon Transportation Safety Committee. Lastly he shared that the Drugged and Drunk Driving Proclamation needs to be reviewed in order to be sent in to the Governor's Office. Rachelle Nelson will send the draft to members for their feedback. Discussion ensued.

Mr. Costales reported that the National Safety Council released a nationwide list of fatalities by state. At that point in time, Oregon was the highest increase in fatalities in the country. He further reminded the Committee and guests that the Oregon Transportation Safety Conference is coming up on October 19 – 20, 2015. Discussion ensued.

V. 2016 OREGON TRAFFIC SAFETY PERFORMANCE PLAN

Chair Hayes reviewed the 2016 Oregon Traffic Safety Performance Plan endorsement process with the Committee. Discussion ensued.

MOTION: Ms. Duke moved that the Committee endorse the 2016 Oregon Traffic Safety Performance Plan. Ms. Vaughan seconded the motion. With no further discussion, the motion passed unanimously.

VI. AGENCY LIAISONS

Driver and Motor Vehicle Services

David Martin reported that DMV wrapped up the successful pilot project to allow them to accept court reports electronically. He shared that they are in the finalization stage of

drafting the administrative rules for the SB 397 ignition interlock device changes. He further reported that the DMV will be adding the IID indicators to the data screens available to law enforcement, effective January 1, 2016. Discussion ensued.

Health Systems Division

Jeff Ruscoe reported that the Oregon Health Authority is still in transition. He also shared that the position formerly held by Chris Hamilton no longer exists.

Multi-Disciplinary Task Force

Kristin Twenge reported that the 2016 Oregon DUII Multi-Disciplinary Impaired Driving Training Conference will be held April 28 – 29, 2016 at The Riverhouse in Bend, Oregon. Registration will likely open in January 2016.

Oregon Association Chiefs of Police

Mr. Costales shared that the legislature is requesting a report on the increase of traffic fatalities. The Transportation Safety Division will be working with law enforcement to gather some information on the amount of funding of patrol hours for impaired driving and occupant protection enforcement.

Oregon District Attorney's Association

Ms. Vaughan reported that the ODAA is trying to set up programs to statistically track marijuana DUIIs. Discussion ensued. Discussion ensued.

Oregon State Police

Greg Plummer reported that he participated in the American Legion Law Enforcement Summer Camp for children. He was able to speak with them about impaired driving enforcement. He further reported that there were 93 crashes, 56 impaired driver arrests, and one traffic fatality over the Labor Day Holiday period. Of those 56 arrests, 36 were alcohol only; 15 were controlled substances only, and 5 were both.

Evan Sether reported that there was a suspected alcohol involved triple fatal crash South of Grants Pass. He further shared that they have finished the second Drug Recognition Expert School. They still need to receive their field certifications. For the 2015/2017 biennium, the OSP is pushing to have everyone in the Patrol Division and Fish and Wildlife Division trained in the Advanced Roadside Impaired Driving Enforcement class. He requested that the Committee give him feedback on what type of statistics they would like to see the DRE program capture. Discussion ensued.

Robert Jones reported that their new Mass Spectrometer was installed. Chair Hayes requested that he give a presentation on the Time of Flight Mass Spectrometer at a future meeting. Discussion ensued.

Oregon State Sheriff's Association

Marianne Novotny reported that there were 49 DUII arrests over the Labor Day Holiday period.

Traffic Safety Resource Prosecutor

Deena Ryerson reported that the baby DA school is coming up. There are 15 to 20 prosecutors that will be trained. She also shared that she is working with Mr. Estes on grants. Discussion ensued.

VII. OLD BUSINESS

Transportation Safety Action Plan Policy Advisory Committee Update

Chair Hayes reported that there is no meeting of the TSAP PAC in September. The October meeting will be lengthier than the regularly scheduled meetings.

DWI Dashboard Questionnaire

Chair Hayes reminded the Committee to return their questionnaires to Rachelle Nelson.

VIII. NEW BUSINESS

Interim Legislative Workgroup on Ignition Interlock Devices

Leah Craft related that they are having conversations with legislators that have expressed interest in this workgroup. Discussion ensued.

CLEAR Alliance

Mandi Puckett gave an overview of the CLEAR Alliance objectives and activities. The acronym stands for Children Learning through Education and Research. Discussion ensued.

Not on the Agenda – Safety Nightlife Advocacy Partnership

Shelley Campbell shared that the SNAP has branched into two areas. It is now called Big Village with one area focused on bars and bar owners and the other addresses youth.

IX. ADJOURN

The next meeting will be held on Friday, October 2, 2015 at the Department of Public Safety Standards and Training. With no further business brought before the Committee, Chair Hayes officially adjourned the GAC on DUIL meeting.
