I. CALL TO ORDER AND INTRODUCTIONS

Chair Chuck Hayes called the meeting to order and introductions were made. Chair Hayes asked for a moment of silence in remembrance of the cause of reducing impaired driving related deaths and injuries in Oregon.

II. CHAIR REPORT

Chair Hayes shared DUII repeat offender data from California. He would like to work with Mary Grosso to see if we can pull this data for Oregon. He further reported that the Oregon Drug Education Conference put on by CLEAR Alliance will be held at Eagle Crest on July 5 – 7, 2016. Lastly, he shared that due to the spread of legalized recreational marijuana, MADD is changing their name to include drugged driving (Mothers Against Drunk and Drugged Driving). Discussion ensued.

III. MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETINGS

This item was tabled due to lack of a quorum.

IV. TSD REPORT

Dan Estes reported that he gave a presentation to the Oregon Transportation Safety Committee regarding the second Traffic Safety Resource Prosecutor that will be hired. He shared that the Law Enforcement Traffic Safety Committee met on Wednesday of this week in Hood River, Oregon. He further reported Governor's Highway Safety Association has \$20,000 grants available for states to increase the number of law enforcement officers to be trained in drug impaired driving issues. The application is

due at the end of January. He shared that he and Chair Hayes are working with Shelley Snow at the Oregon Department of Transportation to assist them in raising the Committee's profile in the media. The idea is that a better Committee public profile will create more recognition and credibility when someone from the Committee testifies during legislative session. He further Mr. Estes mentioned having a planning session for the Committee. The May meeting will be set aside for this purpose. Lastly, he reminded the Committee that the Silver Falls Planning Workshop will be held January 20 – 21, 2016. Discussion ensued.

Troy Costales reported that there is a new Congressional authorization for Transportation funding. The FAST Act comes with new regulations, so the TSD is analyzing it to make sure that Oregon qualifies for everything it can under the new rules. Discussion ensued.

V. 2017 LEGISLATIVE CONCEPTS

Mr. Estes distributed and reviewed the 2016 Interim January Legislative Days committee schedule. Deena Ryerson shared that she met with Rob Bovett to discuss legislation that needs to be fixed for the new recreational marijuana laws. One in particular she requested that he focus on is the use of marijuana while in a motor vehicle, either as the driver or as a passenger. Discussion ensued.

VI. AGENCY LIAISONS

Oregon District Attorney's Association

Jody Vaughan gave an update on Union County cases that she is assigned. She also reported that the ODAA is holding their Winter Conference this week.

Oregon Liquor Control Commission

James Lynch reported that the OLCC is hosting listening tours around the state. He further shared that they are still in the process of hiring. Four of the eleven new positions have been filled. He further gave an update on how the recreational marijuana sales are continuing to roll out and recommends that members and liaisons arrange for a tour of a growing facility. Discussion ensued.

Oregon State Police

Greg Plummer reported that the OSP arrested 48 people for DUII over the Thanksgiving weekend. Thirty-six of the arrests were alcohol only; eleven were drugs only, and one was a combination of alcohol and drugs. He further reported that there were three fatal crashes that they responded to over the Thanksgiving weekend. He shared that he and Evan Sether taught an Advanced Roadside Impaired Driving Enforcement (ARIDE) class for the Oregon State Marine Board. Lastly, he reported that he is gearing up for Patrol In-service from February through June. The entire OSP will receive the most current refresher course for Standard Field Sobriety Testing (SFST). Discussion ensued.

Sgt. Sether reported that the Portland Police Bureau is having an in-house ARIDE class next week. There is another scheduled in La Grande, Newport, Grants Pass, Hermiston

and another in Portland prior to March of 2016. There is a Drug Recognition Expert (DRE) school set for May of 2016. He is also working on scheduling one in July. He reported that there are currently 203 DREs in Oregon. He further shared that the vehicle versus pedestrian crash on November 1, 2015 involved a driver impaired by both alcohol and marijuana edibles. Lastly, he pulled together some data from the oral fluid sample testing that was done at the field certifications. Discussion ensued.

Robert Jones reported that they are still testing the Time of Flight mass spectrometer. He also shared that there is an upcoming conference on marijuana and synthetic cannabinoids in Colorado. Discussion ensued.

Oregon Transportation Safety Committee

Mike Laverty mentioned that the Oregon Impact newsletter recently came out and that they are doing a great job. He shared that the TSD distributed pediatric restraint systems to emergency medical service providers that were in need. He also shared that there are advertisements for the driver education program at malls in Oregon. Lastly, he shared that the OTSC awarded Kristin Twenge a "Driving Force Award" for the work she did on the conference. Discussion ensued.

Public Health Division

Jeff Ruscoe shared that they are putting together a statewide health improvement plan which includes a section on reducing alcohol involved fatalities on the road. He will be working with them to add a section on marijuana involved fatalities as well. Discussion ensued.

Traffic Safety Resource Prosecutor

Deena Ryerson reported that she just got back from meeting with her counterparts in Colorado, Wyoming and Washington and Marilyn Huestis. She recommends that everyone attend the 2016 DUII Multi-Disciplinary Training Conference and attend Dr. Huestis' session. She further shared that she is putting together the agenda for "Protecting Lives, Saving Futures" course to be held at the end of February and first week of March 2016. Discussion ensued.

Department of Public Safety Standards and Training

David Beatty gave an overview of the many courses he has scheduled for the next few months. There will be an SFST instructor conference for mid-April 2016 and an SFST instructor development course for the last week of September 2016. Discussion ensued.

Driver and Motor Vehicle Services

Mary Grosso distributed a copy of what the Law Enforcement Data System screen will show if an ignition interlock device (IID) is required. She also shared the rules for the IID and negative reports. Discussion ensued.

Multi-Disciplinary Task Force

Robert Hayes gave an overview of the agenda for the 2016 DUII Multi-Disciplinary Training Conference. Discussion ensued.

VII. OLD BUSINESS

Transportation Safety Action Plan Policy Advisory Committee Update

Chair Hayes distributed a schedule of the public meetings for the Transportation Safety Action Plan. Discussion ensued.

Interim Legislative Workgroup on Ignition Interlock Devices

Chair Hayes reported that this is still in the works.

DWI Dashboard Questionnaire

Chair Hayes requested that Rachelle Nelson pull together the answers to the questionnaires that have been received prior to the Silver Falls Planning Workshop.

VIII. NEW BUSINESS

Not on the Agenda: News Releases

Chair Hayes mentioned that as he and Mr. Estes works with Ms. Snow on news releases, members may be called on from time to time to help out.

Not on the Agenda: Jermaine Galloway's Conference

James Lynch reported that Jermaine Galloway's conference, the 7th Bi-Annual Northwest Alcohol Conference, will be held in Boise, Idaho in July of 2016.

Not on the Agenda: Students Against Destructive Decisions

Chair Hayes inquired if there are any chapters of SADD in Oregon. Mr. Costales reported that there is not a statewide association, but some schools may have a chapter. Discussion ensued.

Not on the Agenda: High Visibility Enforcement

Mr. Estes reported that the HVE grants are critical, but the number of agencies participating has been declining. He would like assistance determining an approach that will help to boost the number of participating agencies. Discussion ensued.

Not on the Agenda: Urine Testing

Teresa Douglas reported that she has to follow up with treatment providers to determine why they are not doing the level of urine testing that they should. Discussion ensued.
