BOARD ACTION REPORT
January 15, 2016

On January 7, 2016, the Board issued an Order Terminating Consent Agreement. This Order terminates Licensee's February 5, 2015, Consent Agreement.

***Arakaki, Charles Mori, MD; Applicant; Portland, OR**

On January 8, 2016, Applicant entered into a Stipulated Order with the Board for willfully violating any provision of the Medical Practice Act, and representing in any manner that he is authorized to practice medicine in this state. This Order reprimands Applicant and fines Applicant \$5,000.

On January 7, 2016, Licensee entered into a Stipulated Order with the Board for unprofessional conduct; disciplinary action by another state of a license to practice medicine; and failure to report to the Board any adverse action taken against the licensee by another licensing jurisdiction. This Order prohibits Licensee from treating chronic pain with any DEA scheduled medications with the exception of prescribing Suboxone/Subutex for the treatment of addiction and prescribing DEA scheduled medications for inpatient treatment upon discharge; and requires Licensee to disclose Order to present and future employers.

On January 7, 2016, the Board issued an Order Terminating Corrective Action Order. This Order terminates Licensee's July 25, 2007, Corrective Action Order.

This Order reprimands Licensee; fines Licensee \$5,000; prohibits Licensee from performing total hip arthroplasty surgical procedures; requires Licensee to be proctored and observed by a pre-approved, board-certified orthopedic surgeon for 15 orthopedic surgical cases; requires Licensee to obtain a pre-approved mentor to review Licensee's surgical cases and provide reports to the Board for at least six months; requires Licensee to maintain his board certification in orthopedic surgery; requires Licensee to complete a pre-approved documentation course; and requires Licensee to complete a pre-approved behavior management course.

***Morehouse, Samuel Huntington, PA; PA00881; Portland, OR**

On January 7, 2016, the Board issued an Order Terminating Consent Agreement. This Order terminates Licensee's January 13, 2015, Consent Agreement.

***Nelson, Stephen Lanier, MD; MD18996; Medford, OR**

On January 8, 2016, Licensee entered into a Stipulated Order with the Board for unprofessional or dishonorable conduct; gross or repeated acts of negligence; willfully violating any rule adopted by the Board or any Board order or any Board request; and prescribing controlled substances without a legitimate medical purpose, or prescribing without following accepted procedures for examination of patients, or prescribing controlled substances without following accepted procedures for record keeping. This Order reprimands Licensee; fines Licensee \$2,500; places Licensee on probation; prohibits Licensee from treating chronic pain with any DEA scheduled medications; restricts Licensee's treatment of acute or intermittent pain; prohibits Licensee from prescribing Methadone for acute pain or methadone maintenance therapy; prohibits Licensee from prescribing benzodiazepines or muscle relaxants in combination with any opioid medications with specific exceptions; restricts Licensee's treatment of substance use disorder; and requires Licensee to complete 150 hours of pre-approved continuing medical education.

***Osborne, Dori Florence, PA; PA160844; Portland, OR**

On January 7, 2016, the Board issued an Order Terminating Consent Agreement. This Order terminates Licensee's November 7, 2013, Consent Agreement.

***Park, Jae Ok, MD; MD13752; Beaverton, OR**

On January 7, 2016, Licensee entered into a Stipulated Order with the Board for unprofessional or dishonorable conduct; gross or repeated negligence in the practice of medicine; and prescribing a controlled substance without a legitimate medical purpose, or prescribing controlled substances without following accepted procedures for examination of patients, or prescribing controlled substances without following accepted procedures for record keeping. This Order reprimands Licensee; fines Licensee \$5,000; places Licensee on probation; limits Licensee's prescribing for pain; prohibits Licensee from prescribing any Schedule II or III medication in combination with any benzodiazepine or muscle relaxant; requires Licensee to complete a pre-approved CPEP education plan; and requires Licensee to comply with DEA regulations.

***Ravuri, Rajesh, MD; MD23904; Coos Bay, OR**

On January 7, 2016, the Board issued an Order Terminating Corrective Action Agreement. This Order terminates Licensee's July 11, 2013, Corrective Action Agreement.

***Rysenga, Juliet Catherine, MD; MD18740; Ontario, OR**

On January 7, 2016, Licensee entered into a Stipulated Order with the Board for unprofessional or dishonorable conduct, and gross or repeated negligence in the practice of medicine. This Order reprimands Licensee; requires Licensee to have surgical cases monitored by a pre-approved, board-certified ophthalmologist; requires Licensee to complete a pre-approved charting course and a pre-approved boundary course; prohibits Licensee from prescribing for her family or herself; requires Licensee to maintain a relationship with a pre-approved healthcare provider who will provide reports to the Board; and prohibits Licensee from prescribing antipsychotic medications.

On January 8, 2016, Licensee entered into a Consent Agreement with the Board. In this Agreement, Licensee agreed to practice under the supervision of a Board approved mentor for six months, and complete 50 hours of pain management CME.

On January 7, 2016, Licensee entered into a Stipulated Order with the Board for unprofessional or dishonorable conduct; gross or repeated negligence in the practice of medicine; and prescribing a controlled substance without a legitimate medical purpose, or prescribing controlled substances without following accepted procedures for examination of patients, or prescribing controlled substances without following accepted procedures for record keeping. This Order retires Licensee's medical license while under investigation.

On January 7, 2016, the Board issued an Order Terminating Stipulated Order. This Order terminates Licensee's August 10, 1998, Stipulated Order and Licensee's April 18, 2002, Order Modifying Terms of Stipulated Order.

On January 7, 2016, Licensee entered into a Stipulated Order with the Board for unprofessional conduct, and repeated negligence in the practice of medicine. This Order retires Licensee's medical license while under investigation.

APPLICANT)

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1.

The Oregon Medical Board (Board) is the state agency responsible for licensing, regulating and disciplining certain health care providers, including physicians, in the state of Oregon. Charles Mori Arakaki, MD (Applicant) has applied for an active license as a physician to practice medicine in the state of Oregon.

2.

The Board opened an investigation in July of 2015, after receiving a credible report that Applicant's name had been used in advertisements that stated or implied that he was practicing medicine in the State of Oregon. Applicant is not licensed to practice medicine in the State of Oregon. The Board's investigation revealed that Applicant was listed as "Chief of Staff" and "Chief Physician" on advertisements on the internet for the "Universal Men's Clinic" for a Portland, Oregon location, in violation of ORS 677.085. Additionally, Applicant was referred to as "Dr. Arakaki" in radio and television advertisements which aired in Oregon. When the Board's concerns regarding the noted advertising were brought to Applicant's attention, Applicant directed that the advertisements be pulled from further distribution or access.

3.

Applicant and the Board desire to settle this matter by entry of this Stipulated Order. Applicant understands that he has the right to a contested case hearing under the Administrative Procedures Act (chapter 183), Oregon Revised Statutes. Applicant fully and finally waives the right to any appeal in this case by the signing of and entry of this Order in

1 the Board's records. Applicant denies knowingly or intentionally violating Oregon law, but
2 the Board finds that Applicant engaged in conduct that violated ORS 677.190(17), by
3 willfully violating ORS 677.085. Applicant understands that this Order is a public record and
4 is a disciplinary action that is reportable to the National Data Bank and the Federation of State
5 Medical Boards.

7 Applicant and the Board agree to resolve this matter by the entry of this Stipulated
8 Order subject to the following terms

9 4.1 Applicant is reprimanded.

10 4.2 Applicant is assessed a \$5,000 civil penalty, payable in full within 60 days
11 from the signing of this Order.

12 4.3 Upon payment of the \$5,000 civil penalty in full, and having satisfied the
13 other requirements for licensure, the Board will grant Applicant an unrestricted license to
14 practice medicine in the State of Oregon.

15 4.4 Applicant stipulates and agrees that this Order becomes effective the date it is
16 signed by the Board Chair.

17 4.5 Applicant must obey all federal and Oregon state laws and regulations
18 pertaining to the practice of medicine.

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1 Order in the Board's records. Licensee neither admits nor denies, but the Board finds, that he
2 engaged in conduct that violated ORS 677.190(1)(a), as defined by ORS 677.188(4)(a); ORS
3 677.190(15) disciplinary action by another state of a license to practice medicine; and ORS
4 677.190(25) failure to report to the Board any adverse action taken against the licensee by
5 another licensing jurisdiction. Licensee understands that this Order is a public record and is a
6 disciplinary action that is reportable to the National Data Bank and the Federation of State
7 Medical Boards.

8 4.

9 Licensee and the Board agree to resolve this matter by the entry of this Stipulated Order
10 subject to the following terms:

11 4.1 Licensee must not treat chronic pain with any DEA scheduled medications. For
12 the purposes of this Order, chronic pain is defined as pain that persists or progresses over a
13 period of time greater than 30 days. Licensee must not prescribe any Schedule II, III, or IV
14 medication for acute pain for any patient in excess of 30 days for any one year period, and never
15 in excess of 60 Morphine Equivalent Dosage.

16 4.2 Notwithstanding term 4.1 of this Order, Licensee may continue to prescribe
17 Suboxone/Subutex solely for the treatment of addiction. Licensee must comply with all federal
18 regulations applicable to the use of Suboxone/Subutex.

19 4.3 Notwithstanding term 4.1 of this Order, Licensee may prescribe DEA scheduled
20 medications for patients in hospitals where Licensee has privileges during the course of the
21 inpatient treatment stay. Licensee may write prescriptions for patients upon discharge from the
22 hospital for no more than 15 days.

23 4.4 Licensee must immediately inform and provide a copy of this Order to any
24 present employer he may have in the health care field, or any future employers prior to reporting
25 for his first day of work.

26 4.5 Licensee stipulates and agrees that this Order becomes effective the date it is
27 signed by the Board Chair.

The Oregon Medical Board (Board) is the state agency responsible for licensing, regulating and disciplining certain health care providers, including physicians, in the state of Oregon. Thomas Philip McWeeney, MD (Licensee) is a licensed physician in the state of Oregon and holds an active license.

2.

Licensee is a board-certified orthopedic surgeon. The Board opened an investigation after receiving credible information regarding Licensee's medical practice. On July 14, 2014, Licensee and the Board entered into an Interim Stipulated Order in which Licensee voluntarily agreed to cease performing total hip arthroplasty procedures. This Interim Stipulated Order was terminated and replaced with a new Interim Stipulated Order on September 4, 2014, containing the same term. On February 2, 2015, the Board issued a Complaint and Notice of Proposed Disciplinary Action, in which the Board proposed taking disciplinary action pursuant to ORS 677.205(2) against Licensee for violations of the Medical Practice Act.

3.

Licensee and the Board desire to settle this matter by entry of this Stipulated Order. Licensee understands that he has the right to a contested case hearing under the Administrative Procedures Act (chapter 183), Oregon Revised Statutes. Licensee fully and finally waives the right to a contested case hearing and any appeal therefrom by the signing of and entry of this Order in the Board's records. Licensee neither admits nor denies, but the Board finds that Licensee engaged in conduct described in the Complaint and Notice of Proposed Disciplinary

1 Action dated February 2, 2015. Licensee understands that this Order is a public record and is a
2 disciplinary action that is reportable to the National Data Bank and the Federation of State
3 Medical Boards.

4 4.

5 Licensee and the Board agree to resolve this matter by the entry of this Stipulated Order
6 subject to the following sanctions, terms and conditions:

7 4.1 Licensee is reprimanded.

8 4.2 Licensee must pay a civil penalty of \$5,000, payable in full 60 days after the
9 Board Chair signs this Order.

10 4.3 Licensee must not perform total hip arthroplasty surgical procedures as previously
11 voluntarily agreed to in the Interim Stipulated Order of September 4, 2014.

12 4.4 In order to perform any form of surgery, Licensee must have a board certified
13 orthopedic surgeon, pre-approved by the Board's Medical Director, act as proctor and to observe
14 a minimum of fifteen (15) orthopedic surgical cases (from initial incision to completion of
15 surgery) involving a mixture of fracture surgeries/repairs, joint replacement surgeries, as well as
16 complex hand and shoulder surgeries. The pre-approved proctor must discuss with the Board's
17 Medical Director the appropriate mix of surgeries. Upon completion of the fifteen surgeries, the
18 proctor must submit a written report to the Board's Medical Director assessing Licensee's
19 surgical skill and competence. Licensee may then request a modification or termination of this
20 term with a recommendation provided by the proctor in the submitted report.

21 4.5 Licensee must obtain a board certified surgical mentor pre-approved by the
22 Board's Medical Director to review Licensee's surgical cases. Licensee and mentor will meet at
23 least once monthly to discuss and review cases, which must include a review of the indications
24 for surgery, surgical procedures to be employed, the outcome of the surgery, and post-operative
25 follow-up. The mentor must submit a written report every two months to the Board. Licensee
26 may request modification of this term after six months of compliance with the terms of this
27 Order and a positive endorsement from the mentor.

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1 Licensee engaged in conduct described in the Board's Complaint and Notice of Proposed
2 Disciplinary Action dated March 15, 2015. Licensee understands that this Order is a public
3 record and is a disciplinary action that is reportable to the National Data Bank and the Federation
4 of State Medical Boards.

5 4.

6 Licensee and the Board agree to resolve this matter by the entry of this Stipulated Order
7 subject to the following sanctions, terms and conditions:

8 4.1 Licensee is reprimanded.

9 4.2 Licensee must pay a civil penalty of \$2,500, payable in full within 150 days from
10 the signing of this Order by the Board Chair. Licensee may make payments on this amount as
11 long as no single payment is less than \$500.

12 4.3 Licensee is placed on probation for 5 years. Licensee must report in person to the
13 Board at each of its regularly scheduled quarterly meetings at the scheduled times for a
14 probationer interview unless directed to do otherwise by the Board or its Compliance Officer.

15 4.4 Licensee must not treat chronic pain with any DEA scheduled medications. For
16 the purposes of this Order, chronic pain is defined as pain that persist or progresses over a period
17 of time greater than 30 days. Licensee may prescribe DEA scheduled medications for patients
18 who are enrolled in hospice or have a life expectancy of less than six months. Licensee must
19 certify on the written prescription that the patient is a hospice patient.

20 4.5 Licensee may treat acute or intermittent pain, with short acting opiates for no
21 more than 30 days per patient in a calendar year and not to exceed 60 morphine equivalent dose
22 (MED) per day.

23 4.6 Licensee must not prescribe Methadone (Schedule II) for acute pain or methadone
24 maintenance therapy.

25 4.7 Licensee must not prescribe benzodiazepines or muscle relaxants in combination
26 with any opioid medications, except that Licensee may treat acute or intermittent pain with short
27 acting opioids for existing patients in combination with an already prescribed benzodiazepine or
28 muscle relaxant for no more than 30 days. Opioid prescribing in these exceptional instances

1 must not exceed 40 MED per day. Licensee must conduct an informed consent discussion with
2 the patient that is documented in the patient chart in the event of such a prescription. Any opioid
3 prescribing under this exception would apply to the 30 day time frame identified in term 4.4.

4 4.8 Licensee may continue to treat substance use disorder with
5 buprenorphine/naloxone (Suboxone) provided that the patient is not receiving any opioid
6 medication from any other healthcare provider.

7 4.9 Within 18 months from the signing of this Order by the Board Chair, Licensee
