

Oregon Medical Board
BOARD ACTION REPORT
August 15, 2011

The information contained in this report summarizes new, interim, and final actions taken by the Oregon Medical Board between July 16, 2011 and August 15, 2011.

These orders are marked with an * asterisk. **Scanned copies of Corrective Action Agreements are not posted, as they are not disciplinary action and impose no practice limitations.** Complaint and Notices of Proposed Disciplinary Action are not listed in this report, as they are not final actions by the Board. Both Orders, however, are public and are available upon request.

***Field, Frederick, George, MD; MD26105; The Dalles, OR**

Licensee entered into an Interim Stipulated Order with the Board on August 4, 2011. In this Order, Licensee agreed to withdraw from practice pending completion of the Board's investigation into his ability to safely and competently practice medicine.

***Lewis, Todd, Jay, MD; MD13887; Corvallis, OR**

The Board issued an Order Terminating Interim Stipulated Order on August 4, 2011. This Order terminates the April 5, 2011 Interim Stipulated Order.

***Rexin, Douglas, Allen, MD; MD20317; Willamina, OR**

Licensee entered into a Stipulated Order with the Board on August 4, 2011. In this Order, Licensee was reprimanded and surrendered his license and was assessed a fine of \$10,000, with \$9,000 of the fine stayed.

The Oregon Medical Board (Board) is the state agency responsible for licensing, regulating and disciplining certain healthcare providers, including physicians, in the state of Oregon. Frederick George Field, MD, (Licensee) is a licensed physician in the state of Oregon.

2.

The Board received credible information regarding Licensee that resulted in the Board initiating an investigation. The results of the Board's investigation to date have raised concerns to the extent that the Board believes it necessary that Licensee immediately cease the practice of medicine until the investigation is completed.

3.

In order to address the concerns of the Board, Licensee and the Board agree to enter into this Interim Stipulated Order, which provides that Licensee shall comply with all of the following conditions, effective the date this Order is signed by Licensee:

3.1 Licensee voluntarily and immediately withdraws from the practice of medicine and his license is placed in Inactive status, pending the completion of the Board's investigation into his ability to safely and competently practice medicine.

3.2 Licensee understands that violating any term of this Order will be grounds for disciplinary action under ORS 677.190(17).

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4.

At the conclusion of the Board's investigation, Licensee's status will be reviewed in an expeditious manner. Following that review, if the Board determines that Licensee shall not be permitted to return to the practice of medicine, Licensee may request a hearing to contest that decision.

5.

This Order is issued by the Board pursuant to ORS 677.265(1) and (2) for the purpose of protecting the public, and making a complete investigation in order to fully inform itself with respect to the performance or conduct of the Licensee and Licensee's ability to safely and competently practice medicine. Pursuant to ORS 677.425, Board investigative materials are confidential and shall not be subject to public disclosure, nor shall they be admissible as evidence in any judicial proceeding. However, as a stipulation this Order is a public document and reportable to both the National Practitioners Data Bank and the Healthcare Integrity and Protection Data Bank.

1 Limited License, Postgraduate which would allow him to participate in the residency
2 program while his permanent license is suspended.”

3 c. Term 4.5: “Licensee will obey all federal, state and local laws, and all
4 rules governing the practice of medicine in the state of Oregon, as well as all laws
5 pertaining to controlled substances.”

6 d. Term 4.6: “Licensee stipulates and agrees that any violation of the terms
7 of this Order will be grounds for further disciplinary action under ORS 677.190(18).”

8 Licensee has not entered into or completed the required residency program. To date, his medical
9 license remains suspended.

10 2.2 The Board opened an investigation in 2007 after receiving information that
11 Licensee may have engaged in the practice of medicine while his license was suspended. On
12 June 7, 2007, the Board’s Medical Director informed Licensee that the Board was closing the
13 case without further action, but cautioned Licensee that: “the Board requested that I remind you
14 not to represent yourself as a physician in the State of Oregon since your license is currently
15 suspended.” The Board opened a new investigation in 2010 after receiving credible information
16 that Licensee may have engaged in the practice of medicine while his license remained
17 suspended. The Board’s investigation revealed that Licensee signed a document entitled
18 “Psychological Evaluation” for a child (Patient A) who had been a victim of abuse. Licensee
19 signed this document on November 6, 2009, which provided an Axis I diagnosis of “Post trauma
20 (victim of domestic violence and chronic abuse)” and provided a number of recommendations.
21 Licensee signed this evaluation report as “Douglas A. Rexin, M.D.” By contributing to this
22 evaluation report and signing the document in this matter, Licensee violated the terms of the
23 Stipulated Order, dated October 13, 2006, in that Licensee signed an evaluation report that
24 provided a diagnosis and recommendations using the initials “M.D.” behind his name while his
25 medical license was suspended.

26 2.3 On August 9, 2010, Licensee met with a Board Investigator in regard to this
27 investigation. Licensee informed the investigator that this case stemmed from a dispute he had

1 with Patient A's treating psychiatrist. He also informed that investigator that the purpose of the
2 evaluation report was to provide an opinion regarding reports that Patient A might be
3 experiencing hallucinations and displayed inappropriate sexual behaviors. Without an active
4 medical license, Licensee is prohibited from attempting to change a physician's treatment plan or
5 to provide a medical opinion.

7 Licensee and the Board desire to settle this matter by the entry of this Stipulated Order, in
8 which Licensee surrenders his license under investigation. Licensee understands that he has the
9 right to a contested case hearing under the Administrative Procedures Act (chapter 183), Oregon
10 Revised Statutes, and fully and finally waives the right to a contested case hearing and any
11 appeal therefrom by the signing of and entry of this Order in the Board's record. Licensee
12 admits that he engaged in the conduct described in paragraph 2, and that this conduct violated
13 ORS 677.190(1)(a) unprofessional or dishonorable conduct, as defined in ORS 677.188(4)(a),
14 and ORS 677.190(17) willfully violating any Board order. Licensee understands that this Order
15 is a public record and is a disciplinary action that is reportable to the National Practitioner Data
16 Bank, the Healthcare Integrity and Protection Data Bank and the Federation of State Medical
17 Boards.

19 Licensee and the Board agree to resolve this matter by the entry of this Stipulated Order
20 subject to the following terms and conditions:

21 4.1 Licensee permanently surrenders his license to practice medicine while under
22 investigation.

23 4.2 Licensee is permanently prohibited from engaging in the practice of medicine in
24 the state of Oregon.

25 4.3 Licensee must pay a fine of \$10,000, \$1000 payable in full within 120 days from
26 the signing of this Order by the Board Chair, but the obligation to pay \$9000 of the fine is

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
