BOARD ACTION REPORT
June 16, 2009 – July 15, 2009

The information contained in this report summarizes new, interim, and final actions taken by the Oregon Medical Board between **June 16, 2009 – July 15, 2009**.

Scanned copies of Interim Stipulated Orders, Orders of Emergency Suspension, Stipulated Orders, Final Orders, Termination Orders, Modification Orders and Voluntary Limitations are included at the end of this report in the order that they appear in the report. These orders are marked with an * asterisk. **Scanned copies of Corrective Action Orders/Corrective Action Agreements are not posted as they are not disciplinary action and impose no practice limitations.** Complaint and Notices of Proposed Disciplinary Action are not listed in this report as they are not final actions by the Board. Both Orders, however, are public and are available upon request as described below.

***BAKER, Bradley Eugene, MD; MD28119; Portland, OR**

The Board issued an Order for Emergency Suspension on June 25, 2009. This Order requires Licensee to immediately cease the practice of medicine until otherwise ordered by the Board.

BOOKWALTER, Matthew, DPM; DP00347; Chinle, AZ

Licensee and the Board entered into a Corrective Action Agreement on July 9, 2009. In this Agreement Licensee agreed to pay a \$1,000 civil penalty payable within 60-days and accurately complete and report required continuing education on a timely basis to the Board.

DORDEVICH, Dejan M., MD; MD10741; Portland, OR

Licensee entered into a Corrective Action Agreement with the Board on July 9, 2009. In this Agreement, Licensee agrees to complete a course on charting within six months. The course is to be pre-approved by the Board's Medical Director. This Order shall remain in effect for one year after the Board Chair signs this Agreement and Licensee's patient records that are created following the completion of the course on charting may be subjected to no-notice inspections by the Board's Compliance Officer or investigative staff. Licensee shall pay for an audit if concerns are round.

***FIKS, Vladimir Borisovich, MD; MD19358; PORTLAND, OR**

The Board issued an Order Terminating Stipulated Order on July 9, 2009. This Order terminates Licensee's April 12, 2006 Stipulated Order.

FU, Yi, AC; AC01265; Portland, OR

The Board issued an Order Terminating Corrective Action Order on July 9, 2009. This Order terminates Licensee's February 5, 2009 Corrective Action Order.

GRAHAM, BARBARA ANN, MD; MD15611; PORTLAND, OR

The Board issued an Order Terminating a Corrective Action Order on July 9, 2009. This Order terminates Licensee's May 8, 2007 Corrective Action Order.

Licensee entered into an Interim Stipulated Order with the Board on July 8, 2009. In this Order, Licensee agreed to withdraw from practice pending the conclusion of the Board's investigation.

Licensee and the Board entered into a Corrective Action Order on July 9, 2009. In this Order the Board now terminates the Stipulated Order dated May 31, 2006. Licensee will practice with the benefit of a practice mentor pre-approved by the Board's Medical Director and will meet at least twice a month to conduct chart review and to discuss ongoing patient care issues. The practice mentor will provide the Board with quarterly written reports. Licensee's practice location is subject to no-notice compliance visits by a Board designee.

***WHITE, David Glenn, MD; LL17525; New Park, PA**

Licensee entered into a Stipulated Order with the Board on July 9, 2009. In this Order Licensee surrenders his license to practice medicine while under investigation.

***WRIGHT, Francis Joseph, MD; MD22592; Roseburg, OR**

The Board issued an Order of Emergency Suspension on June 25, 2009. This Order requires Licensee to immediately cease the practice of medicine until otherwise ordered by the Board.

***YANKEE, JOSEPH EARL, DO; DO19458; OREGON CITY, OR**

Licensee entered into an Interim Stipulated Order with the Board on June 18, 2009. In this Order, Licensee voluntarily withdraws from the practice of medicine and his license is placed in Inactive status pending completion of the Board's investigation into his ability to safely and competently practice medicine.

1.

The Oregon Medical Board (Board) is the state agency responsible for licensing, regulating and disciplining certain health care providers, including physicians, in the state of Oregon. Bradley Eugene Baker, MD (Licensee) is a licensed physician in the state of Oregon.

2.

Licensee has a documented history of substance abuse and mental health related diagnoses and treatment. Licensee enrolled in the Health Professionals Program (HPP) in June of 2008. On May 17, 2009, Licensee submitted a letter to HPP in which he withdrew from his participation in the program and disclosed his intention to seek an active locum tenens practice.

In response to Licensee's action, HPP discharged Licensee for unsuccessfully completing the program and failure to honor the contract that he signed with HPP. On April 26, 2009, Licensee revoked his signed authorizations for disclosure of information between HPP and the Board. HPP subsequently obtained a court order to release its records to the Board. On June 23, 2009, HPP notified the Board that Licensee was discharged from its program due to his unsuccessful completion. HPP reported that during his enrollment with HPP, Licensee often did not participate in the program in good faith by, for example, not complying with his providers' treatment recommendations and the monitoring process.

3.

Based on the above information and the evidence available to the Board at present, the Board has determined that Licensee has a condition that could adversely impact his ability to

1 safely and competently practice medicine and that his continued practice or ability to practice
2 medicine constitutes an immediate danger to the health or safety of the public.



4 The Board orders that pursuant to ORS 677.205(3), the license of Bradley Eugene Baker,
5 MD, is suspended on an emergency basis and that Licensee immediately cease the practice of
6 medicine until otherwise ordered by the Board.

16 Licensee is entitled to a hearing as provided by the Administrative Procedures Act (Chapter 183),
17 Oregon Revised Statutes. Licensee may be represented by counsel at the hearing. If Licensee
18 desires a hearing, Licensee must request a hearing in writing within ninety (90) days of the receipt
19 of or mailing of this Emergency Suspension Order to Licensee. Upon receipt of a request for a
20 hearing, the Board will hold a post-suspension hearing as soon as practicable and will notify
21 Licensee of the time and place of the hearing.

22 If Licensee requests a hearing, Licensee will be given information on the procedures, right of

The Oregon Medical Board (Board) is the state agency responsible for licensing, regulating and disciplining certain health care providers, including physicians, in the state of Oregon. Kellie Marissa Sprangel, MD (Licensee) is a licensed physician in the state of Oregon.

2.

In April of 2009, the Oregon Medical Board began an investigation of Licensee after receiving information involving Licensee's practice situation in Southern Oregon, a fatal car crash in 2009, and her health status. Based on this information, as well as concerns regarding her previous practice in Redmond, the Board has immediate concerns about the Licensee's ability to safely and competently practice medicine.

3.

Due to the need to protect the public, and due to the Board's concerns stemming from the ongoing investigation, Licensee and the Board agree to the entry of this Interim Stipulated Order, which provides that Licensee shall comply with all of the following conditions:

3.1 Licensee voluntarily and immediately withdraws from the practice of medicine pending completion of the Board's investigation. Licensee's Oregon medical

1 license shall be placed on Inactive status, effective the date that Licensee signs
2 the Order.

3 3.2 Licensee agrees to sign all necessary releases so that the Board will receive a
4 copy of any records regarding her past and ongoing medical care, to include all
5 medications, and any evaluations and/or treatment plans that have been
6 suggested for or received by Licensee.

7 3.3 Licensee understands that failure to comply with this Order will be grounds for
8 disciplinary action under ORS 677.190(18) and may result in an emergency
9 suspension of her medical license.

12 At the conclusion of the Board's investigation, Licensee's status will be reviewed in
13 an expeditious manner. If the Board determines, following that review, that Licensee should

The Oregon Medical Board (Board) is the state agency responsible for licensing, regulating and disciplining certain health care providers, including physicians, in the state of Oregon. David Glenn White, MD (Licensee) holds an expired limited license to practice medicine in the state of Oregon.

2.

Licensee received a limited license on May 20, 2008 for the purpose of taking the Special Purpose Examination (SPEX). Applicants for a medical license in Oregon may be required to take SPEX. Licensee had until November 19, 2008 to pass SPEX. Licensee did not take SPEX, and has subsequently moved out of state. Prior to receiving a limited license to practice medicine in Oregon, Licensee wrote a prescription for Premarin (conjugated estrogen) for an adult female patient without the legal authority to write a prescription in Oregon.

3.

The expiration of Licensee's limited license does not deprive the Board of its authority to address Licensee's conduct in Oregon relating to the practice of medicine, ORS 677.175(3). Licensee and the Board agree to close this investigation with the stipulation that Licensee will surrender his license under investigation, consistent with the terms of this Order. Licensee admits and the Board finds that Licensee's conduct described in paragraph 2 violated ORS 677.190(1)(a) unprofessional or dishonorable conduct, as defined in ORS 677.188(4)(a). Licensee understands that he has the right to a contested case hearing under the Administrative Procedures

1 Act (chapter 183), Oregon Revised Statutes and fully and finally waives the right to a contested
2 case hearing and any appeal therefrom by the signing of and entry of this Order in the Board's
3 records. Licensee understands that this document is a public record and is reportable to the
4 National Practitioners Data Bank.

6 Licensee and the Board agree to resolve this matter by the entry of this Stipulated Order
7 subject to the following conditions:

8 4.1 Licensee surrenders his license to practice medicine while under investigation.

The Oregon Medical Board (Board) is the state agency responsible for licensing, regulating and disciplining certain health care providers, including physicians, in the state of Oregon. Francis Joseph Wright, MD (Licensee) is a licensed physician in the state of Oregon.

2.

The acts and conduct that support this Order for Emergency Suspension follow:

2.1 On May 1, 2009, Licensee began to work as a locum tenens physician in the emergency department at the Good Shepherd Medical Center in Hermiston. Licensee was scheduled to work until June 30, 2009. During his first week of employment, hospital staff reported that Licensee appeared to be very tired, jittery, and difficult to awaken during evening shifts. At the outset of his employment, Licensee approached two physicians on different occasions at the hospital and asked them to prescribe zolpidem (Ambien, Schedule IV) for his use. They both refused. Licensee subsequently approached a nurse practitioner in the emergency room on May 1, 2009 and again requested a prescription for zolpidem for his use which was granted. On May 2, 2009, the Licensee approached a different nurse practitioner in the emergency room and again requested a prescription for zolpidem for his personal use which was granted. The Licensee did not disclose to either nurse practitioner his earlier successful or unsuccessful attempts to obtain these prescriptions. The Licensee filled these two prescriptions at separate pharmacies on May 4 and May 5, 2009. One of those forms may have been altered to authorize three refills. On May 13, 2009, Licensee was observed taking a blank prescription
