**BOARD ACTION REPORT**  
**November 15, 2014**

The information contained in this report summarizes new, interim, and final actions taken by the Oregon Medical Board between October 16, 2014 and November 15, 2014.

Scanned copies of Interim Stipulated Orders, Orders of Emergency Suspension, Stipulated Orders, Final Orders, Termination Orders, Modification Orders and Voluntary Limitations are included at the end of this report in the order that they appear in the report. These orders are marked with an \* asterisk. **Scanned copies of Consent Agreement are not posted, as they are not disciplinary action and impose no practice limitations.** Complaint and Notices of Proposed Disciplinary Action are not listed in this report, as they are not final actions by the Board. Both Orders, however, are public and are available upon request.

On November 6, 2014, Applicant entered into a Corrective Action Agreement with the Board. In this Agreement, Applicant agreed to voluntarily limit surgical procedures to outpatient procedures under local anesthesia; notify any facility where he is credentialed of this Agreement; complete 30 hours of Board-approved CME; and practice under the supervision of a Board-approved mentor for six months.

**Katancik, Cynthia Ann, PA; Applicant; West Linn, OR**

On November 5, 2014, Applicant entered into a Consent Agreement with the Board. In this Agreement, Applicant agreed to complete a pre-approved 12 week clerkship, specific requirements regarding supervision and chart review from her supervising physician, and that her supervising physician would submit reports to the Board regarding his progress in her return to the practice of medicine.

**\*Kim, Sik Kiyoshi, MD; MD22289; Portland, OR**

On October 29, 2014, the Board issued an Order of License Suspension to immediately suspend licensee's medical license due to her willfully violating a Board rule, specifically continuing medical competency (education).

**Kobayashi, Kari Marie, PA; PA156305; Portland, OR**

On November 4, 2014, Licensee entered into a Consent Agreement with the Board. In this Agreement, Licensee agreed to specific requirements regarding supervision and chart review from her supervising physician, and that her supervising physician would submit reports to the Board regarding his progress in her return to the practice of medicine.

**\*Traina, Pamela Ann, MD; MD13805; Klamath Falls, OR**

On October 29, 2014, the Board issued an Order of License Suspension to immediately suspend licensee's medical license due to her willfully violating a Board rule, specifically continuing medical competency (education).

**\*Uschold, Anna Lyn, PA; PA164139; Medford, OR**

On October 29, 2014, the Board issued an Order Terminating Consent Agreement. This Order terminates Licensee's October 28, 2013, Consent Agreement.

2 In order to address the concerns of the Board and for purposes of resolving this matter,  
3 Applicant and the Board agree to the following terms:

4 4.1 Applicant agrees to voluntarily limit his performance of surgical procedures to  
5 outpatient procedures under local anesthesia.

6 4.2 Applicant must notify the administrator of any hospital, clinic, or other health care  
7 facility where he has credentials or obtains credentials of this Agreement and the contents  
8 thereof.

9 4.3 Within six months from the effective date of this Agreement, Applicant must  
10 complete 30 hours of Category I primary care CME pre-approved by the Board's Medical  
11 Director.

12 4.4 For a minimum of six months from the effective date of this Agreement,  
13 Applicant must practice under the supervision of a practice mentor pre-approved by the Board's  
14 Medical Director. This practice mentor must submit bi-monthly reports to the Board's Medical  
15 Director outlining Applicant's progress in his practice of medicine in a primary care setting.

16 4.5 Once Applicant completes terms 4.3 and 4.4 of this Agreement, he may submit  
17 written documentation of his successful compliance with these terms, and a letter in support of  
18 termination of these terms from his practice mentor, to the Board's Medical Director. Upon  
19 review and approval by the Medical Director, these terms may be terminated. Applicant will be  
20 notified in writing of such termination when and if it occurs.

21 4.6 Applicant must obey all federal and Oregon state laws and regulations pertaining  
22 to the practice of medicine.

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
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1           4.7    Applicant agrees that any violation of the terms of this Agreement constitutes

The Oregon Medical Board (Board) is the state agency responsible for licensing, regulating and disciplining certain health care providers, including physicians, in the state of Oregon. Cynthia Ann Katancik, PA (Applicant) is a physician assistant who has applied for licensure in the state of Oregon.

2.

Applicant graduated from Gannon University with a bachelor of science in physician assistant studies in 1980 and practiced in the state of New York until September of 1998. Applicant submitted an application for a physician assistant license in the state of Oregon on September 25, 2013. Applicant's current certification with the National Commission on Certification of Physician Assistants expires December 31, 2015, and she has submitted documentation of 764 Category I AMA CME hours obtained between 1991 and 2013.

3.

In regard to the Applicant's absence from medical practice for a period of over two years, Applicant and the Board desire to ensure public safety by entry of this Agreement in the Board's records. Applicant understands that she has the right to a contested case hearing under the Administrative Procedures Act (chapter 183), Oregon Revised Statutes. Applicant fully and finally waives the right to a contested case hearing and any appeal therefrom by the signing of and entry of this agreement in the Board's records. This Agreement is a public document, however, it is not an adverse action.

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In order to address the concerns of the Board and for purposes of ensuring Applicant's safe re-entry to practice, Applicant and the Board agree that the Board will close this matter and grant Applicant an active license to practice medicine in the state of Oregon, contingent upon Applicant satisfying the following conditions:

4.1 Applicant must complete a twelve week full-time clerkship, pre-approved by the Board's Medical Director. Applicant's clerkship supervisor must submit monthly reports to the Board's Medical Director detailing Applicant's progress in the clerkship.

4.2 Upon completion of the clerkship and Applicant entering into a Practice Agreement with an Oregon licensed physician, Applicant's supervising physician must conduct 100% chart review of Applicant's charts for the first 30 days of practice. After 30 days the required chart review shall be 50% of charts for the next 30 days, 30% for the next 60 days, and 20% for the next 30 days. After six months, chart review is reduced to 10% of charts per month.

4.2 After Applicant's first 30 days of practice, her supervising physician must submit a report to the Board's Medical Director detailing Applicant's progress in the practice of medicine. A second report must be submitted after Applicant has practiced with her supervising physician for six months.

4.3 Once Applicant completes the terms of this Agreement, she may submit written documentation of her successful compliance with the terms of this Agreement, and a letter in support of termination of this Agreement from her supervising physician, to the Board's Medical Director. Upon review and approval by the Medical Director, this Agreement may be terminated. Applicant will be notified in writing of such termination when and if it occurs.

The Oregon Medical Board (Board) is the state agency responsible for licensing, regulating and disciplining certain health care providers, including physicians, in the state of Oregon. Kari Marie Kobayashi, PA (Licensee) is a physician assistant who holds an inactive license to practice medicine as a physician assistant in the state of Oregon.

2.

Licensee graduated from the Idaho State University Physician Assistant Program on August 5, 2011, and was granted an Oregon physician assistant license on June 11, 2012. Licensee has not practice medicine since graduating from her training program in 2011, and her Oregon license reverted to inactive status on April 8, 2013. Licensee submitted a complete application to reactivate her license on September 11, 2014. She is currently certified by the National Commission on Certification of Physician Assistants (NCCPA) and has completed 108.75 hours of NCCPA approved continuing education courses in the last two years.

3.

In regard to the Licensee's absence from medical practice for a period of over two years, Licensee and the Board's desire to ensure public safety by entry of this Agreement in the Board's records. Licensee understands that she has the right to a contested case hearing under the Administrative Procedures Act (chapter 183), Oregon Revised Statutes. Licensee fully and finally waives the right to a contested case hearing and any appeal therefrom by the signing of and entry of this agreement in the Board's records. This Agreement is a public document, however, it is not an adverse action.

2 In order to address the concerns of the Board and for purposes of ensuring Licensee's  
3 safe re-entry to practice, Licensee and the Board agree that the Board will close this matter and  
4 grant Licensee an active license to practice medicine in the state of Oregon, contingent upon  
5 Licensee satisfying the following conditions:

6 4.1 For a minimum of 30 days, Licensee must practice under the personal supervision  
7 of her supervising physician. Licensee's supervising physician must conduct 100% chart review  
8 of Licensee's charts. At the end of 30 days, Licensee's supervising physician shall submit a  
9 report to the Board's Medical Director outlining the quality of Licensee's work and her ability to  
10 safely practice medicine.

11 4.2 Upon approval of the Board's Medical Director, the required chart review will be  
12 reduced to 50% of charts for the next 30 days, 30% for the next 60 days, and 20% for the next 90  
13 days. After six months, chart review is reduced to 10% of charts per month, contingent on the  
14 approval of the Board's Medical Director.

15 4.3 Once Licensee completes the terms of this Agreement, she may submit written  
16 documentation of her successful compliance with this Agreement, and a letter in support of  
17 termination of this Agreement from her supervising physician, to the Board's Medical Director.  
18 Upon review and approval by the Medical Director, this Agreement may be terminated.  
19 Licensee will be notified in writing of such termination when and if it occurs.

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1           4.4    Licensee must obey all federal and Oregon State laws and regulations pertaining  
2 to the practice of medicine.
