Next Gen 9-1-1 Committee

- This committee has formulated a statement of work document for a Private Managed 9-1-1 Emergency Services Internet Protocol (IP) Network to enable interoperability of Voice and Data to the Public Safety Agencies and First Responders.
- The statement of work document has been submitted to the State 9-1-1 Advisory Committee for review .

Next Gen 9-1-1 Committee

- Once the statement of work document has been approved by the State 9-1-1 Advisory Committee, the Next Gen 9-1-1 Committee will either hire a consultant to create an Request for Proposal (RFP) for a 9-1-1 IP Network, or possibly write the RFP ourselves, as Washington State did.
- The goal is to have an RFP out by 1st Qtr of 2010.

 - Create statewide standard NG 911 operational guidelines.
 - Develop a detailed plan for statewide NG 911 implementation.
 - Designate beta site testing for NG 911
