<p>The Registered Nurse who Participates in Cosmetic Procedures (Gretchen)</p>	<p>The draft interpretive statement (IS) was distributed to the group for review and comment.</p> <p>Comments:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Look at third-party private payer language for potential definitions of terms used in IS. • Articulate that the RN should access Oregon Health Licensing Offices administrative rules related to applicable modalities (e.g., cosmetology, tattooing, electrolysis, etc.) frequently for potential updates related to licensure requirements. • Use consistent sequencing in each section by identifying applicable NPA standard(s) requiring the action first; then proceed with content discussion showing application of the standard(s).
<p>NEW! Community Based RN Delegation Interpretive Statement (Gretchen)</p>	<p>Work to begin on a new interpretive statement on the topic of RN Delegation in Community-Based Settings. Deborah Cateora to chair this subcommittee. Subcommittee members: Julia Willis, Ann Vrabel, Linda Bifano, and Pamela Ferguson.</p> <p>Gretchen to send frequently asked questions on the topic of Community-Based RN Delegation to Deborah for distribution to subcommittee.</p> <p>Nancy to send subcommittee members' email addresses to Deborah.</p>
<p>Interpretive Statement: Authority to Accept and Implement Orders with FAQs (Gretchen)</p>	<p>This is the draft document formerly known as <i>Standing Orders Used by RNs and LPNs</i>. It proposed that the document title be changed to match/reflect the codified activity that it is addressing. Rationale for the draft title change:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The licensee is responsible to adhere to Division 45 standards when exercising the scope of practice authority to accept and implement an order for client care and treatment. These standards apply each and every time the licensee engages in the activity. • The identifier, name, or term an organization or agency may use when referring to an <i>order</i> is not something that is regulated by the Board. • The term <i>standing orders</i> is not codified in the Nurse Practice Act. • Generating an interpretive statement that assists the licensee in their application of existing standards when implementing an order (which might be organizationally referred to as a “standing order”, “a protocol”, or “an order set”), keeps the licensee focused on his/her legal responsibilities when accepting and implementing orders.

Infusion Therapy Guidelines (Gretchen)	No subcommittee update to report; discussion differed to May 20 th , 2016 NPC Meeting. Subcommittee work continues on this document.
General query to NPC members: how is the unlicensed assistive person (UAP) utilized in your respective practice settings and under whose authority does the UAP work? (Gretchen)	<p>Responses:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • School Health Assistants. They refer to a first aid book. There is a direct nurse supervisor along with oversight by an RN who delegates to the assistant. They can provide subcutaneous insulin injections, and perform G Tube feedings. RN can teach them how to administer epi-pen injection for an emergency situation. "I tell the new RNs everything you learned in nursing school you have to apply here, and then expand!" • Used in assisted living facilities, adult foster homes, work under MD orders. Depends on the facility type and job description for what they do. RN may delegate nursing tasks and supervise them related to the delegation. • In various community based facilities, the facility administrator is responsible. • Hospital: Utilized as cardio vascular technicians under the cardiologist, operating room and surgery technicians under the surgeon, and emergency department technicians under the physician. • Hospital: Emergency department under the MD and follow job description. In the psych center they are in more of a companionship role so not sure under whose authority.
