□ When an unlicensed person serviced two types of consumer electronic entertainment equipment – televisions and VCRs – the commissioner held that the person was a service dealer and violated ORS 702.050(1) by servicing such equipment without the license required by ORS 702.090(1). ---- *In the Matter of Tom’s TV & VCR Repair, 12 BOLI 110, 115 (1993).*

□ When an unlicensed person advertised his TV and VCR repair services in a local newspaper, posted two signs at his place of business indicating that he repaired TVs and VCRs, and told a potential customer that he serviced such equipment, the commissioner held that the person indicated or represented that he was in the business of repairing consumer electronic entertainment equipment, in violation of ORS 702.050(3). ---- *In the Matter of Tom’s TV & VCR Repair, 12 BOLI 110, 115 (1993).*

□ When an unlicensed person advertised that he was in the TV and VCR repair business, in violation of ORS 702.050(3), and serviced that equipment, in violation of ORS 702.050(1), the commissioner assessed a \$1,000 civil penalty for servicing the equipment without a license, and a \$500 civil penalty for advertising the business. ---- *In the Matter of Tom’s TV & VCR Repair, 12 BOLI 110, 116 (1993).*

□ When an unlicensed person continued to indicate that he was in the business of servicing consumer electronic entertainment equipment and continued to service such equipment for months after the agency advised him of the licensing requirements and after he had failed the technician’s exam, the commissioner held that this behavior seriously aggravated his violations of ORS 702.050(1) & (3). ---- *In the Matter of Tom’s TV & VCR Repair, 12 BOLI 110, 116 (1993).*

NOTE: ORS Ch. 702 was repealed in its entirety by the 1995 legislature at 1995 Or Laws c.386 §1.
