Call To Order: The meeting was called to order by the President at 7:30 a.m. at the Board office; 1515 SW 5th Avenue, Suite 602, Portland, Oregon.

Strategic Planning

Dr. Martin said that she wanted the Board to continue its discussion of the Board's Strategic Plan, which was started at the June 28 meeting. She said that the notes from the June meeting had been circulated and the Six-Year Plan has been distributed as Draft # Three. She said that many of the outcomes that the Board had identified had been incorporated into the agency budget document under "Agency Initiatives" and asked that the Board review these two documents for any further modification. Ms. Lee asked if the two documents could be combined. Dr. Martin said that it would be done. Dr. Martin said that one specific issue she wanted the Board to address in preparation for the Legislative Session and in line with the Board's identified goals was to review what the Board sees as needing to be changed (if anything) regarding ownership of dental practices; i.e., are there things that need to be in the statute that aren't there? Dr. McCully said that one of the issues that is frustrating is seeing cases where a patient has been seen for years at the same multi-practitioner clinic and there are problems with the care provided but no one dentist can be identified as having done anything wrong. There is no way in these situations for the Board to discipline the group practice. Dr. Grant and Ms. Lee stated that the law needs to address the issue of requiring that one dentist be identified as the "primary dentist in charge" so that the Board and the patient know who is responsible for the over care of the patient. The Board discussed the concept of regulating dental practices. It was agreed that this might be more than the Board can or would want to deal with. As long as there is an identified "dentist in charge" there should be reasonable accountability for patient care. It was pointed out that there is already language regarding this under 679.020(4) regarding dental clinics operated by labor organizations. Dr.

Martin asked if the Board had a concern, in the context of the Board's Mission to protect patient care, about the minority ownership of dental practices by non-licensees. Both Dr. Kelley and Ms. Young said that they felt that a 49% ownership by a non-licensee might produce an undue influence on a dentist but that they would be comfortable with a lesser percentage – perhaps 25%. Dr. Short said that all licensees need to be responsible for patient care issues and that he does not believe that any minority percentage amount should make a difference as long as it is less than 51%. Ms. Lee said that the focus needs to be on licensees being responsible for patient care not on tax advantages or who operates a dental practice. The Board consensus was that the Board had no issue with the concept of minority ownership in principle. The Board also confirmed its continued support of the Board's position in 2000 regarding changes needed to the statute regarding ownership: 1. Government entities should be authorized to own and operate a dental clinic. 2. Quasi-governmental entities (such as OHSU) should be authorized to own and operate a dental clinic. 3. Non-profit groups should be allowed to own and operate dental clinics. And 4. Provision should be made for the orderly transition of a dental practice when the owner dentist becomes disabled or dies.

EXECUTIVE SESSION: The Board entered into Executive Session pursuant to ORS 192.660(1)(f), (h) and (k); ORS 676.165, ORS 676.175 (1), and ORS 679.320 to review records exempt from public disclosure, to review confidential materials and investigatory information, and to consult with counsel.

REVIEW OF NEW COMPLAINTS, COMPLETED INVESTIGATIONS, PREVIOUS CASES REQUIRING BOARD ACTION, AND LICENSURE APPLICATION ISSUES

The Board reviewed summaries of new complaints and reviewed completed investigation reports and related investigatory materials.

PERSONAL APPEARANCES AND COMPLIANCE ISSUES

NEW BUSINESS

ASSOCIATION REPORTS

Oregon Dental Association

Dr. Mark Jensen reported that the Ownership Taskforce is working hard on developing legislation that will address the issue of ownership of dental practices. He said the Taskforce feels strongly that they will have a mutually agreed upon final product before the Legislature convenes in January. Dr. Jensen said that the ODA is looking forward to supporting the Board's legislative package at the next Legislative session. He said that the ODA receives a lot of telephone calls asking about what courses qualify for meeting the Board's required C.E. He said there is a lot of confusion about what will meet the requirement that courses are "directly related to clinical patient care." He requested that the Board provide clarification on this issue. Ms. Fletcher added that courses that are being questioned are related to HIPAA, coding, OSHA courses and practice management.

Dr. Jensen congratulated Dr. McCully on his recognition as Dentist of the Year by the Oregon Academy of General Dentistry. He then introduced Dr. Jan Peterson as the next ODA Vice President who will be attending Board meetings as ODA liaison.

Oregon Dental Hygienists' Association

Ms. Ironside said the ODHA had no report.

COMMITTEE AND LIAISON REPORTS

WREB Examiner and Committee Reports

- Board of Directors Meeting and Dental Exam Review Committee
Dr. Johnson reported that he attended the Dental Exam Review Committee meetings July 17 and the WREB Board of Directors meeting July 18 in Park City, Utah. He said that WREB, CRDTS and SRTA continue to collaborate and work toward one common clinical exam sometime in the future. He also reported that the Board of Directors voted to change the 2003 dental exam to give candidates the option of performing any two out of three restorations. The candidates must choose among a posterior composite, amalgam or cast gold restoration. Dr. Johnson also said that he has noticed the importance of continuity for the person who represents the Board on the WREB Board of Directors and the Dental Exam Review Committee.
- Dental Hygiene Exam Review Committee
Ms. Lee reported that she attended the WREB Dental Hygiene Exam Review Committee meeting on July 17 in Park City. She said that the ERC spends a lot of time fine-tuning the exams and reviewing post-op care issues. She mentioned the WREB proposal to raise the pass rate from 70% to 75% and that the ERC approved this proposal. Ms. Lee explained that this is not a matter of making the exam more difficult, instead it is a weighting issue—adjusting the point alignment, which will not affect the pass rate.

Standing Committee and Liaison Reports

- Western Conference of Dental Examiners and Dental School Deans
Ms. Bones reported that she attended the Western Conference in Park City, July 19 – 21. The theme of the conference was “The role of the patient in clinical education and dental testing.” She said it was a very good conference with presentations from dental schools, examining boards, State boards, AADE and the American Dental Student Association. The consensus of the meeting was dental and dental hygiene education and examination for licensure still needs to use patients. Ms. Bones said that if anyone is interested, the meeting materials are in her office. Next year’s conference will be July 18-20 in New Mexico.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR’S REPORT

Budget Status

A budget status report, including expenses paid and revenue received through June 2002, was provided for Board review. Ms. Bones said that this report, showing end of the first fiscal year, puts the Board budget in a good position with 51% of projected revenues received and 48% of approved budget spent.

CORRESPONDENCE

Nevadans for Oral Health Care Coalition, Shari Peterson, CDA, RDH, M.Ed. requesting information regarding self-regulation of dental hygienists. Board members indicated that the writer of this letter does not understand that Oregon does not have self-regulation for dental hygienists. Ms. Bones said that this had been explained to Ms. Peterson but that she had requested that the letter be presented to the Board. The Board instructed that Ms. Bones reiterate to the writer the Board's regulations regarding Limited Access Permits.

Oregon Department of Justice regarding Emergency Management Assistance Compact. Ms. Lindley explained that the Emergency Management Assistance Compact allows a professional licensed in one State to practice in another State that is a member of the Emergency Management Assistance Compact to meet a declared emergency or disaster, subject to such limitations and conditions as the Governor of the requesting state may prescribe by executive order or otherwise.

Glen M. Shimshak, DMD regarding the issue of dental hygienists providing care to patients who have received both a single agent oral sedative and nitrous oxide sedation. Staff was directed to inform Dr. Shimshak that a only dentist holding a Class II anesthesia permit may perform procedures on patients receiving both an oral sedative and nitrous oxide. After some discussion, Dr. Kelley said that this and other anesthesia related issues need to be addressed by the Anesthesia Committee.

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License and Examination Issues

- Board-approved courses in Soft Relines
The Board received two requests for approval of proposed courses in the application of soft relines on full dentures – one from James H. Tyack, DMD, MAGD; and one from Sheri Billetter, CDA, EFDA. After discussion of the Board's minimum standard of this course, Dr. McCully moved and Dr. Kelley seconded that the Board approve the two courses submitted. The motion passed with Dr. Grant, Dr. Kelley, Ms. Lee, Dr. McCully, Dr. Short, Mr. Swart and Ms. Young voting aye.

Further, the Board instructed that staff could approve courses administratively as long as the proposed course is at least three hours in duration and which includes a combination of lecture, written exam, laboratory exercise and clinical experience. The following eight areas should be covered: OAR Division 42 rule regarding placement of temporary soft relines in full dentures by an EFDA, patient health history review; infection control issues; OSHA regulations; use of dental equipment and instruments;

indications/contraindications for temporary soft relines in full dentures; materials; and appropriate technique.

- Request to reinstate retired license
Dr. Donald Christie requested that the Board allow him to reinstate his dental license, which he retired July 8, 1998. Ms. Bones explained that the Board's rules require that a retired license must be reinstated within four years and there is no provision for exceptions to this rule. Dr. McCully moved and Dr. Kelley seconded that the Board deny Dr. Christie's request and advise him of the process for obtaining a new dental license. The motion passed with Dr. Grant, Dr. Kelley, Ms. Lee, Dr. McCully, Dr. Short, Mr. Swart and Ms. Young voting aye.
