

Accesses community hospitals when necessary


Uses a managed care model




Percent of Total Prison Population by Age Group

Challenges for Medical Services

- **Lack of electronic health records**
- **Shortage of infirmary beds for males on the west side of the state**
- **Increase in chronic illnesses**
- **Recruitment of physicians and nurse practitioners**
- **Increase in medical complexity**



Medicaid

- Federal funds are available through the Federal Financial Participation Program (FFP). The portion paid by the federal government to states for their share of expenditures for providing Medicaid services.
- Major Components
 - Inpatient stays by AIC in qualified facilities are covered
 - \$12.5 million estimated in cost avoidance
 - Program runs through Oregon Health Authority (OHA)
 - HB 2087 gives ODOC permission to sign Medicaid applications on behalf of AIC



Behavioral Health Services

Purpose

Provides assessment for diagnosis, crisis management, and medically necessary treatment based on a community standard of care.

Mental health treatment based on diagnosis and level of functioning. Mental health housing based on identified level of need and housing availability.

We strive to manage inmates in the least restrictive environment possible.

Mental Health Special Housing

Mental Health Infirmery - Crisis Response and Stabilization - Short term

Intermediate Care Housing – Intermediate Long term housing for inmates who cannot be managed safely in General Population housing; Step down from MHI and BHU.

Behavioral Housing Unit - Treatment and management for inmates with highest mental health need who have engaged in dangerous behavior towards others.

General Population Housing

Day Treatment - Provides enhanced case management and treatment; Step down from MHI, ICH.


Mental Health Housing - Dorm or celled housing for identified inmate care giver workers and a community of identified offenders with mental health needs and/or cognitive functioning requiring stable support and assistance.

General Population - Assigned housing unit for ODOC offenders who do not demonstrate a need for alternative housing; Least restrictive environment.

Challenges for BHS

- **Space and environmental factors not conducive to mental health treatment**
- **Difficulty recruiting and retaining psychiatric mental health nurse practitioners and psychiatrists**
- **Limited safe housing options, staffing, and specialized treatment environments**
- **New PREA standards require training, implementation, follow-up, and increased service delivery needs**
- **Mental health diagnoses combined with criminality create high level of case complexity.**
- **Lack of electronic medical record system**

To purchase, package, and distribute pharmaceuticals to DOC institutions for the inmate population

To coordinate the purchase, maintenance, and repair of diagnostic and medical treatment equipment

To distribute instruments, nursing supplies, and durable medical goods to DOC institutions


Challenges for Pharmacy
