1. Request for approval of revised 1991-93 budget proposal for the Natural Heritage Advisory Council.
2. Request for approval to sell to the Oregon Department of Corrections 80 acres of Common School Fund land within the boundary of the proposed Oregon Medium Security Correctional Complex near Ontario, Malheur County.

 - a. Request by the Division of State Lands to initiate rulemaking procedures for adoption of a state agency coordination plan and coordination procedures as required under ORS 197.180.
