Ms. Felton described the rollout of the Residency Supervision Orientation training. Licensees can get continuing education credit for taking the training.

VII. OBPE LEGISLATIVE CONCEPTS

Ms. McHugh led a discussion on potential legislative concepts that the Board would like to advocate for during the 2013 Legislative Session. The concepts are due to DAS on May 1, 2012. The Board directed Ms. McHugh to proposed

changes to the licensure exemptions; particularly where “loop-holes” exist that unintentionally allow the unlicensed practice of psychology.

VIII. BUDGET MATTERS

Ms. McHugh reviewed the budget process with the board, including how the budget is “built” and the stages of development and approval. Ms. McHugh informed the Board that there could be a budget short-fall for 2011-2013 due to legal costs for administrative hearings and legal counsel fees.

1. POLICY MATTERS

- a) BLSW Legislative Concept: Ms. McHugh presented the Board of Licensed Social Work’s 2013 legislative Concept. The Board had no objections. Ms. McHugh will let the BLSW administrator know, that OBPE supports this concept.
- b) Behavior Analysts: Ms. McHugh reviewed the legislation proposed during the 2012 Legislative Special Session. She also discussed national trends for licensing Behavior Analysts.

IX. DISCIPLINARY SUPERVISION GUIDELINES

Dr. Shallcross discussed her revisions to the disciplinary supervision guidelines that are given to supervisors at the beginning of supervision. The supervision guidelines explain the supervisors responsibilities, and are tailored to meet the various disciplinary scenarios.

X. BOARD APPOINTMENTS

Dr. Ferder described the meeting she and Ms. McHugh had with Kendall Clawson, Governor’s Appointments Officer, and Sean Kolmer, Governor’s Health Policy Advisor. The new Board appointments are schedule to be made in May, 2012. Ms. Clawson plans to vet each candidate for the 250+ boards and commissions she over-see. Ms. Clawson explained that finding the right candidate was time consuming and they had not yet decided on re-appointments and/or new members for OBPE.

CONSUMER PROTECTION STATISTICS

18 complaints have been filed in 2012. There are currently 52 open cases under investigation (including the investigation files scheduled for Board consideration), with 3 in the contested case process. Of the open cases under investigation, 40 are regarding licensed practice (including 3 applicants) and 12 are regarding unlicensed practice.
