

2. Oregonians eligible for Medicaid will have a more streamlined process to apply online through Oregon Health Authority


## Accountability and oversight for Transition Project

    - CMS gate reviews




# Major deliverables to move commercial enrollment to healthcare.gov

- No new exchange technology development
- Transition project: Update businesses processes to work with federal process
- CMS: Works directly with plans to connect them to healthcare.gov



# Major deliverables to move Medicaid eligibility function back to OHA

- Online application for Medicaid on state website
- Transfer current MAGI Medicaid eligibility determination technology to OHA
- Bi-directional consumer account transfer between federal technology and OHA systems
- Connection of federal system to OHA's system to screen for current Medicaid coverage
