

CHIP Process

AllCare collaborated with the other two CCOs serving Jackson and Josephine counties to complete the CHIP process. The CHIP was based on data from the Community Health Assessment. CAC members from each CCO formed a committee and conducted focus groups and community meetings, and consumer and provider surveys, to gather input from the community regarding strategies to include in the CHIP. Some strategies will be implemented in collaboration with the three CCOs, while other strategies will be specific to AllCare.

In Curry County, AllCare's CAC adopted the Community Health Needs Assessment completed by Curry Community Health, and added an addendum to meet the needs of the CCO. The CAC members also conducted focus groups, community meetings, and gathered information through surveys to include in the CHIP.

AllCare continues to engage the CAC in collaborative efforts with community partners to develop and implement our CHIP strategies.

Healthy Beginnings

Early Investment

Identify Early Learning Hub tasks and opportunities to collaborate

Adverse Childhood Experiences/Trauma

Increase awareness of ACEs body of research and implications for practice

Healthy Food and Physical Activity

Collaborate to increase physical activity opportunities and healthy food access for youth

Collaborate with local community gardens to engage youth in gardening

School-Based Health Centers

Support school-based health centers, explore possible expansion to include dental and addictions prevention

Healthy Living

Chronic Pain, Prescription Drug Abuse

Continue to support Opioid Prescribers Group (OPG) task force, including media campaigns

Mental Health

Identify opportunities for future CAC engagement in improving mental health integration and access

Built Environment

Identify opportunities for collaboration on improving built environment projects

Health Equity

Housing

Identify opportunities for collaboration on reducing the number of youths who are experiencing homelessness

Food Insecurity

Support current food bank programs

Cultural Competency and Language Access

Increase provider cultural competency

Increase number of medical interpreters

Transportation

Improve quality and availability of non-emergent medical transportation



Strategies



Support School-Based Health Centers

Expand to include mental health, addictions prevention and dental services. Increase access to healthy food through school-based food programs.



Early Learning Hubs

Collaborate with Early Learning Hubs across the service area to expand parent education, preventive health screenings, and early intervention programs for children and young families

Promote developmental assessments for children 0-36 months

Increase enrollment in primary care homes for more effective coordination of physical, mental and oral health services



Built Environment

Collaborate to support built environment projects such as sidewalk improvements, bike paths, walking trails, and exercise facilities and programs.

AllCare staff serve on a community task force to develop an aquatic center in Curry County. Support of this project may include sponsoring facilitation and project development, purchase of equipment or funding exercise programs for the community.



Food Insecurity

Collaborate with local food banks to provide chronic disease-specific food boxes and food that appeals to different ethnic populations
