Trillium CCO Structure

- Trillium is an Oregon health plan owned by Centene Corporation with both Medicare, Medicaid and Commercial health plans.
- Trillium serves nearly 100,000 Oregon Health Plan members in Lane County and surrounding areas.
- Trillium has a strong partnership with Lane County; TBH is a county delegate.

LTC Relationships

- Trillium and Senior & Disability Services have an MOU to help guide care for members in both systems.
- Members with high healthcare needs receive priority for care coordination.
- Joint staffing for LTC eligible members includes Trillium, TBH, S&DS, PCPs, community resources such as LILA, and others as needed.

Collaboration-Integration

- Trillium's Medical Management Team (MM) works closely with TBH to address the complex needs of disabled and older adult members—including mental health, physical health and substance use.
- Co-located MM and TBH offices assist this endeavor.
- Strong relationships between staff result in clear communication and member-centric responses.

Community Health Workers

- Trillium employs 6 Community/ Traditional Health Workers
- Visit members in their homes or living facilities
- Decrease barriers to engagement in needed services, medication compliance, use of resources
- Monitor member health challenges

Lane County Older Adult Behavioral Health Specialist (OABHS) Initiative

- Oregon Health Authority has designated 25 OABHS across the state to assist in meeting the behavioral health needs of older or disabled adults.
- OABHS are systems coordinators and assist with planning, promotion, education, coordination and complex placement for disabled and older adults (age 64 and up).

CCO and OABHS

- Trillium MM staff, TBH staff, and OABHS collaborate to meet the needs of Lane County residents who are disabled, over age 64, and need additional assistance to access the best services for their care.
- Integration with primary care, aging services, the behavioral health system, and community resources contributes to success.
