Subject: Incentives for Data Submission

The Addictions and Mental Health (AMH) Division is implementing the new Measures and Outcomes Tracking System (MOTS) to improve care, control cost and share information. This new system will replace the current Client Processing Monitoring System (CPMS). The comprehensive behavioral health electronic data system allows AMH to collect data from community mental health programs (CMHP) and their subcontractors that receive flexible funds through the AMH County Financial Assistance Agreement. AMH also collects data from Native American tribes and others who provide behavioral health services.

MOTS will allow AMH to stay current with the AMH System Change Initiative and the Oregon Health Authority (OHA) Health System Transformation. This is a change to the current way of collecting data; therefore, AMH is offering incentives to encourage adoption.

AMH will provide incentive dollars to those CMHPs, tribes, and other direct county contractors that meet the new MOTS data submission requirements. These funds will be in addition to funds already contracted during the 2013-2015 biennium and will be assigned based on population census data. The contract will be amended to reflect these incentive payments, which will be disbursed in a lump sum.

All CMHPs, tribes, and other direct county contractors are eligible to receive incentives. To receive incentive dollars, contractors must enter their current caseload into MOTS, including all subcontractors, by August 1, 2014. This data can be submitted to MOTS via Web client entry or by electronic data interchange (EDI). The data elements contractors are required to submit to MOTS can be found in the *MOTS Reference Manual* located on the MOTS data collection website at www.oregon.gov/oha/amh/pages/compass/electronic-data-capture.aspx).

Once an eligible contractor meets the requirements, the contractor will submit a report (attachment A) to initiate the contract amendment and receive the incentive payment. AMH will validate the report to ensure the data are complete by reviewing historical client data and comparing it to MOTS. See the attached spreadsheet for the incentive breakdown by contractor (attachment B).
