

## Policy on AMH Non-Medicaid Service Data Submission

*The Addictions and Mental Health (AMH) Division contracts with Community Mental Health Programs (CMHP) to provide behavioral health services across the state. These contracts require submission of status (demographic and outcome) data, as well as, non-Medicaid service data. The non-Medicaid service data submission is required for procedures rendered to a client where those procedures are paid for with public funds, none of which include Medicaid. Public funds exclude private insurance and/or 100% private pay, unless the services provided are DUII or Methadone (see below).*

*These reportable non-Medicaid services are typically paid for with dollars via the AMH County Financial Assistance Agreement. Do not submit duplicate services (Medicaid and Non-Medicaid) for the same procedure. Services which require non-Medicaid service data submissions are those that have a CPT (Current Procedural Terminology) or HCPCS (Healthcare Common Procedure Coding System) code.*

To Summarize:

<b>Description of Service</b> <i>(Follow steps in order)</i>	<b>Submit AMH Service Data?</b>	<b>Notes</b>
1. <i>The procedure is funded in whole or in part by Medicaid or OHP. (If not, continue to step 2).</i>	<b>No</b>	<i>AMH has access to the Medicaid Encounters.</i>
2. <i>The procedure is part of a DUII or Methadone service. (If not, continue to step 3).</i>	<b>Yes</b>	<i>DUII and Methadone service procedures must be reported if not funded by Medicaid or OHP.</i>
3. <i>The procedure is funded by private insurance or 100% private pay. (If not, continue to step 4).</i>	<b>No</b>	
4. <i>The procedure has no Medicaid/OHP funding, no Private Insurance funding, and is not 100% Private Pay, but is publicly funded.</i>	<b>Yes</b>	

*Flow chart on page two may also prove helpful in deciding whether or not to submit a Non-Medicaid Service.*




Figure 1 - AMH Non-Medicaid Service Reporting
