

# NEW Specialty for Pharmacist Provider Specialty:

## What is changed?

The Oregon Board of Pharmacy is expanding the scope of practice for pharmacists to include prescribing birth control pills and patches (they currently dispense, not prescribe).

January 1, 2016 – The expanded practice option for pharmacists becomes effective.

Pharmacists need additional Oregon Board of Pharmacy training in order to be eligible for this program.

Oregon State University is actively training Pharmacists for this new role. The first cohort of pharmacists have already completed the training.

Details for 109 specialty.

- Board of Pharmacy license required
- Certificate issued by Oregon State University showing completion of Pharmacists Prescribing Hormonal Birth Control training required
- NPI required; Taxonomy code: 1835P0018X
- Most 50/109 providers will be enrolled as rendering providers under a pharmacy biller (type 48).
  - Required forms/documents if enrolled under a pharmacy biller: 3113 and copy of training certificate
  - Required forms/documents for providers in practice for themselves: 3114, 3972, 3975, 3973, copy of license, copy of training certificate, NPI, taxonomy code, SSN
