

## Oregon Medicaid reimbursement for doula services

This fact sheet explains how doulas can work with Medicaid-enrolled practitioners to serve Oregon Health Plan members on a fee-for-service (“open card”) basis.

### Become a certified and registered Traditional Health Worker (THW).

### Enroll with OHA as a fee-for-service Oregon Medicaid provider

Use the [DMAP 3113](#) form to enroll.

### Partner with a Medicaid- enrolled licensed practitioner.

You will need to have an agreement with the practitioner that states you will provide services and be reimbursed by the practitioner as a practice expense.

- **For labor and delivery support**, the practitioner must be a physician or advance practice nurse (*e.g.*, Certified Nurse Midwife) enrolled with the Division of Medical Assistance Programs (DMAP).
- **For maternity case management (MCM) support**, the practitioner must be a licensed, DMAP-enrolled physician, physician assistant, nurse practitioner, certified nurse midwife, direct entry midwife, social worker or registered nurse.

### Doula services covered by Oregon Medicaid

**For labor and delivery support**, DMAP will reimburse the practitioner \$75 for face-to-face support that the doula provides during labor and delivery.

**For MCM support**, DMAP will reimburse the practitioner for services delivered to patients for whom the licensed practitioner has completed an initial MCM assessment and client service plan. Doulas may be reimbursed by the practitioner for MCM services supervised and signed off by the practitioner. Services may include face to face visits, care coordination, childbirth counseling services, home visits, and more.
