### **Health advisory lifted for Dexter Reservoir** ***Reduced blue-green algae levels confirmed***

A health advisory issued for Dexter Reservoir located 20 miles southeast of Eugene on Oregon Highway 58 in Lane County was lifted today by the Oregon Health Authority. The advisory was issued August 13 because of high levels of blue-green algae in the lake.

Water monitoring has confirmed the blue-green algae cells present in the lake are below the health advisory guidelines for both individual and combined cell counts and for all cyanotoxins produced.

Oregon health officials advise people who recreate in Oregon water bodies to always be alert to signs of algae blooms. People and their pets should avoid contact if the water is foamy, scummy, thick like paint, pea-green, blue-green or brownish red in color, or a mat of algae is visible in the water.
