Need for the Rule(s):

Funds for the Wildfire Damage Housing Relief Account were allocated during the 2015 Legislative Session through HB 3148. The program became effective on July 1, 2015. Temporary rules were adopted and will sunset on February 13, 2016. The Wildfire Damage Housing Relief Account will serve as a resource for homeowners who have lost their primary home due to wildfires.
