OLCC Commissioners approve liquor licenses, beverage redemption center, and issue sanctions

BEND, OR - The monthly meeting of the Oregon Liquor Control Commission was held at the Deschutes Services Building, 1300 NW Wall St., in Bend, Oregon.

On June 27, 2013, the Commissioners approved the following Limited On-Premises sales licenses:

The Beer Porches, 2231 NE Alberta Street, Portland. Licensee is The Beer Porches, LLC; Suzanne Moodhe, member. The license is approved with restrictions.

Captured Beer Bus, 137 SE 28th Ave., Portland. Licensee is Brian White. The license is approved with restrictions.

The Commissioners approved the following bottle redemption center:

BottleDrop Redemption Center, 1917 Lancaster Dr. NE, Salem; Oregon Beverage Recycling Cooperative (OBRC)

The Commissioners appointed Joe Feuerstein as the retail liquor agent for store **#1186, Portland Eastport**.

The Commissioners ratified the following sanctions based on stipulated settlement:

Piedmont Place, 736 N. Lombard, Portland; will pay a fine of \$1,485 or serve a nine-day liquor license suspension for permitting two minors to be on the licensed premises or in an area of the licensed premises prohibited to minors. Licensee is The Four Horsemen, Ltd.; Brian Huss and Michelle Stubbs, corporate principals.

The Anchor Bar #35, 11915 N. Center, Portland; will pay a fine of \$825 or serve a five-day liquor license suspension for permitting a minor to be in an area of the licensed premises prohibited to minors. Licensee is Oregon Restaurant Services, Inc.; Dan Fischer, Marwin Hofer, Michael Evans, and Jim Thares, corporate principals.

The Vault Bistro & Lounge, 209 E. 2nd, The Dalles; will pay a fine of \$2,475 or serve a 15-day liquor license suspension for permitting unlawful activity on the licensed premises when individuals provided private security services without being certified to do so. Licensee is Park Avenue Jones, Inc.; Michael L. Leash, corporate principal.

Everybody's Market, 2113 Portland Road, Newberg; will pay a fine of \$1,155 or serve a seven-day liquor license suspension for conviction of Attempt to Commit a Class B Felony – Possession of a Controlled Substance, which was committed on the licensed premises. Licensee is Everybody's Market #1, Inc.; Fakeer Rahim, Habib Naseri, and Kahn Naseri, corporate principals.

Voodoo Martini, 507 E. 1st Street, Newberg; will pay a fine of \$2,970 or serve an 18-day liquor license suspension for two violations. The first violation is for permitting employees to mix, sell, or serve alcoholic beverages, or supervises those who do, without a valid service permits. The second is for refusing to give an OLCC regulatory employee potential evidence when the regulatory employee lawfully requested it. Licensee is Voodoo Martini, LLC; Alexander Arthur and Cal Erath, members.

The Commissioners ratified the following stipulated settlement for failing to verify the age of a minor before allowing him or her to buy or be served an alcoholic beverage when he or she reasonably appeared to be under 26 years of age:

Spring Street Market, 1910 Spring St., Medford; will pay a fine of \$1,485 or serve a nine-day liquor license suspension. Licensee will also be removed from the Responsible Vendor Program. Licensee is Curtis Wagoner.

Viking Inn, 1155 Ivy St., Junction City; will pay a fine of \$1,485 or serve a nine-day liquor license suspension. Licensee is JKT, Inc.; John W. Pyatt, Katherine L. Bates, and Thelma R. Pyatt, corporate principals.

Bugsy's, 559 Ivy St., Junction City; will pay a fine of \$1,485 or serve a nine-day liquor license suspension. Licensee is Bugsy's, Inc.; James Stoddard and Lynn Stoddard, corporate principals.

Shedd Market & Deli, 31901 "B" Street, Shed; will install age verification equipment and will use the equipment to verify the age of every person who reasonably appears under 26 years old. Licensee will also pay a fine of \$330 or serve a two-day liquor license suspension. Licensees are Julie Bain and Leon Bain.

Solstice Brewing Company, 234 N. Main Street, Prineville; has paid a fine of \$1,485. Licensee is BC Brewing, LLC; Joseph Barker, member.

El Rodeo, 785 SE Third St., Bend; has paid a fine of \$3,795 and will be removed from the Responsible Vendor Program. Licensee is Appaloosa Corporation; Rodolfo Arias and Lorena Arias, corporate principals.

Bayshore Chevron, 600 N. Bayshore Drive, Coos Bay; will pay a fine of \$1,495 or serve a nine-day liquor license suspension. Licensee will also be removed from the Responsible Vendor Program. Licensee is Mayper Corporation; May M. Jenson, corporate principal.

The Commissioners ratified the following stipulated settlements for permitting an employee(s) to mix, sell, or serve alcohol or supervise those who do without a service permit:

Gresham Inn, 117 N. Main Street, Gresham; will pay a fine of \$1,485 or serve a nine-day liquor license suspension. Licensee is Elray Corporation, Raymond Salvi, corporate principal.

Marcello's, 5 Ponderosa Road, Sunriver; will pay a fine of \$1,485 or serve a nine-day liquor license suspension. Licensee is Marsand, Inc.; Thomas Lodge, Dixie Lodge, and Thaddeus Lodge, corporate principals.

The five citizen commissioners are the policy-making body of the OLCC. They meet monthly for one or two days to make decisions on liquor licenses, rules, contested case hearings and appointments of liquor store agents. Commission meetings are held every other month at OLCC's main office, 9079 SE McLoughlin Blvd., Room 103A in Portland. Subsequent months, the meetings are held via phone.
