OLCC Commissioners appoint Distillery Retail Liquor Outlets, appoint new Liquor Agents and approve Liquor Licenses

Portland, OR – At their monthly meeting Friday, February 21, 2014, the Commissioners of the Oregon Liquor Control Commission appointed two additional distilleries as Distillery Retail Liquor Outlets:

Oregon Ryegrass Spirits, Christopher Beatty; 720 NE Granger, Ave.; Corvallis
Rogue Ales Public House, Brett Joyce; (five locations) Rogue Ales, Portland; Rogue Company Store, Portland; Rogue House of Spirits, Newport; Rogue Ales PH, Astoria; and Brewer's on the Bay, Newport.

Distillery retail agents have the ability to allow sales of their own distilled spirits products at the location of their distillery outlet and up to five additional outlets per distillery license.

"With 47 distillers in Oregon and 51 distillery retail liquor outlets, local distilleries are expanding their role in Oregon's economy," says Brian Flemming, OLCC Retail Services Director. "By allowing them to sell the products that they produce, customers can enjoy the full distillery experience and have the opportunity to purchase Oregon-made products right from the manufacturer."

The Commissioners appointed two liquor agents at the following liquor stores:

Eugene West, Store #1229, Tim Woodhead

Retail liquor agents are private, independent contractors; they are not state employees. The Retail Services Division of the OLCC works closely with liquor agents to help them understand and follow liquor regulations and store operating procedures.

The Commissioners approved the following new liquor licenses:

The Commissioners applied restrictions to **The Lot**, 745 NW Columbia Street, Bend. Licensee is The Grotto, LLC; David Staley and Michelle Staley, members. License was granted with restrictions through stipulated settlement.

The Commissioners ratified the following fines and liquor license suspensions based on stipulated settlement:

HENRY ESTATE WINERY, 687 Hubbard Creek Road, Umpqua; will pay a fine of \$3,465 or serve a 21-day suspension for permitting four minors under the age of 18 to be in an area of the business that is prohibited to minors. Licensee is Scott Henry's Winery Corporation; Scott Henry, corporate principal.

UPTOWN MARKET, 6620 SW Scholls Ferry Road, Beaverton; will pay a fine of \$2,145 or serve a 13-day liquor license suspension for employees drinking alcoholic beverages while on duty. Licensee is Uptown Market, LLC; Stuart Faris, Amos Shepard, Chris Shepard, members.

PROST PORTLAND, 4237 N Mississippi, Portland; will pay a fine of \$1,485 or serve a nine-day liquor license suspension for permitting an employee to provide private security services without being certified to do so. Licensee is Prost German Pubs, Inc., Chris Navarra and Dan Hart, corporate principals.

B & B DINING & SPIRITS, 213 S Front St., Creswell; will pay a fine of \$1,485 or serve a nine-day liquor license suspension for two violations. The first violation is for failing to verify the age of a minor before allowing her to be served an alcoholic beverage. The second violation is for permitting an employee to mix, sell, or serve alcoholic beverages, or supervise those who do, without a valid service permit. Licensee is Emerald Island Corporation; Garnet Starr, corporate principal.

The Commissioners ratified the following stipulated settlements for failing to verify the age of a minor before allowing him or her to buy or be served an alcoholic beverage when he or she reasonably appeared to be under 26 years of age:

AHERN'S STOP & SHOP, 268 NW 5th, Madras; will pay a fine of \$1,485 or serve a nine-day liquor license suspension. Licensee is Mamaji, LLC; Sanjeev Kumar, member.

STAR SUSHI 2, 293 E Main Street, Ashland; will pay a fine of \$330 or serve a two-day liquor license suspension. Licensee will also install age verification equipment and will use the equipment to verify the age of every customer purchasing alcohol who reasonably appears to be under 26 years old. Licensee is Star Sushi 2, LLC; Ricky Nam and Hyon Suk Nam, members.

PIZZA HUT, 1924 Biddle Road, Medford; will pay a fine of \$1,155 or serve a seven-day liquor license suspension. Licensee is PacPizza, LLC; James Gresset and Michael Long, members.

BLUE PINE KITCHEN & BAR, 25 SW Century Dr., Bend; will pay a fine of \$1,155 or serve a seven-day liquor license suspension. Licensee is Players Bar, Inc.; Joshua Maquet, corporate principal.

The Commissioners ratified the following stipulated settlements for permitting an employee(s) to mix, sell, or serve alcohol or supervise those who do without a service permit:

SPORTS PAGE, 8590 SW Hall Boulevard, Beaverton; has paid a fine of \$1,815. Licensee is SP1, LLC; Robert Jackson, Jr., member.

JOE'S SPORTS BAR & GRILL/STAR CATERING, 2061 Roberts Rd., Medford; will pay a fine of \$1,485 or serve a nine-day liquor license suspension. Licensee is JZLS Enterprises, Inc.; Joe Stella, Christine Stella, John Sawyer, and Linda Sawyer, corporate principals.

STANFORD'S RESTAURANT & BAR, 12200 N Parker Ave, Portland; will pay a fine of \$1,485 or serve a nine-day liquor license suspension. Licensee is Restaurants Unlimited, Inc.; Chris Harter, Tim Mullany, Christopher Metz, Donald Mueller, and RU Corporation, corporate principals.

WOW BURGER OF OREGON, 10107 NE Cascade Parkway, Portland; will pay a fine of \$1,815 or serve an 11-day liquor license suspension. Licensee is Wow Burger of Oregon, LLC; CCK Restaurants, LLC, member.

PUTTER'S BAR & GRILL, 4506 SE Woodstock, Portland will pay a fine of \$1,485 or serve a nine-day liquor license suspension. Licensee is 6000 Glisan, Inc.; Willene Goforth, Peter Goforth, Peter B. Goforth Trust, corporate principles.

The five citizen commissioners are the policy-making body of the OLCC. They meet monthly for one or two days to make decisions on liquor licenses, rules, contested case hearings and appointments of liquor store agents.
