OLCC Commissioners approve sanctions for liquor law violations

PORTLAND, Ore. – At its monthly meeting on March 27, the Commissioners of the Oregon Liquor Control Commission ratified the following fines and liquor license suspensions based on stipulated settlement:

Round Table Pizza #392, 10389 SE 82nd Ave., Portland; will serve a 48-day liquor license suspension for two violations. The first violation is for failing to verify the age of a minor before allowing him to buy or be served alcohol when he reasonable appeared under 26 years old. The second violation is for permitting employees to mix, sell, or serve alcoholic beverages, or supervise those who do, without a valid service permit. Licensee is Round Table Development Company; Robert McCourt, Ted Storey, Gregg Fleury, Tinka Gordon, Thomas Guilford, James Robertson, Kenneth Stanecki, Erick Bjerkholt, Robert Fox, Peter Mattson, and Jack Robertson, corporate principals.

Muu Muu's, 612 NW 21st Street, Portland; will pay a fine of \$4,785 and serve a 21-day liquor license suspension or serve a 50-day liquor license suspension for eight violations. Licensee will also accept restrictions on the liquor license. The first violation is for failing to admit OLCC inspectors into the business to conduct a reasonable search for compliance with liquor laws. The second violation is for employees making false statements to the OLCC in order to prevent action by the Commission. The third violation is for an employee being under the influence of intoxicants while on duty. The fourth violation is for an employee forcibly resisting lawful arrest. The fifth violation is for permitting an employee to mix, sell, or serve alcoholic beverage, or supervise those who do, without a valid service permit. The sixth violation is for an employee drinking alcoholic beverages while on duty. The seventh violation is for destroying, removing, or concealing potential evidence by emptying glasses of alcohol being consumed after hours. The eighth violation is for employees and a customer dispensing, serving, and/or consuming alcohol at the business after 2:30 a.m. and before 7:00 a.m. Licensee is The 21 Company, Inc.; David Chien, corporate principal.

Pho Viet & Café, 1326 NE 3rd Street, Bend; will pay a fine of \$2,970 or serve an 18-day liquor license suspension for two violations. The first violation is for failing to verify the age of a minor before allowing him to buy or be served alcohol when he reasonable appeared under 26 years old. The second violation is for permitting employees to mix, sell, or serve alcoholic beverages, or supervise those who do, without a valid service permit. Licensee is Pho Viet & Café, LLC; Tan Vo and Minhtam Nguyen, members.

The Commissioners ratified the following stipulated settlements for failing to verify the age of a minor before allowing him or her to buy or be served an alcoholic beverage when he or she reasonably appeared to be under 26 years of age:

King Bo Restaurant & Lounge, 2555 Jacksonville Hwy, Medford; will pay a fine of \$2,145 or serve a 13-day liquor license suspension. Licensee is King Bo, Inc.; David Yu and Helen Yu corporate principals.

Stop And Go Mini Mart, 1699 NE Highway 20, Bend; will pay a fine of \$1,485 or serve a nine-day liquor license suspension. Licensee is Couch investments, LLC; Kent Couch, member.

Ladd's Shell and Food Mart, 1525 SE Ladd Ave., Portland; will pay a fine of \$3,795 or serve a 23-day liquor license suspension. Licensee is Issac Petroleum, LLC; Issac Dweik, member.

The Commissioners ratified the following stipulated settlements for permitting an employee(s) to mix, sell, or serve alcohol or supervise those who do without a service permit:

Santiam Wine Company, 1555 12th Street SE, #130, Salem; will pay a fine of \$1,815 or serve an 11-day liquor license suspension. Licensee is DJR Corporation, Debra Rios and Jesse Rios, corporate principals.

The Whiskey Bar, 31 NW 1st Ave., Portland; will pay a fine of \$3,795 or serve a 23-day liquor license suspension. Licensee is Ink Entertainment, LLC; Kecia Nathan, member.
