OLCC Commissioners appoint liquor store contract and issue sanctions for liquor law violations

PORTLAND, Ore. – At its monthly meeting on September 25, 2015, the Commissioners of the Oregon Liquor Control Commission appointed Teresa Lee as the retail liquor agent for Veneta, #1190.

Retail liquor agents are private, independent contractors; they are not state employees. The Retail Services Division of the OLCC works closely with liquor agents to help them understand and follow liquor regulations and store operating procedures.

The Commissioners ratified the following fines and liquor license suspensions based on stipulated settlement:

2 AMIGOS RESTAURANT, 22605 NE Halsey #F, Fairview; will pay a fine of \$2,970 or serve an 18-day liquor license suspension for two violations. The first violation is for failing to verify the age of a minor before allowing him to buy or be served an alcoholic beverage when he reasonably appeared to be under 26 years of age. The second violation is for permitting Corporate Principal Marquez to mix, sell, or serve alcoholic beverages, or supervise those who do, without a valid service permit. Licensee is Marquez Enterprises, Inc.; Eduardo Marquez, corporate principal.

CHIPOTLE MEXICAN GRILL, 9687 NE Cascades Parkway, Portland; will pay a fine of \$2,640 or serve a 16-day liquor license suspension for two violations. The first violation is for failing to verify the age of a minor before allowing her to buy or be served an alcoholic beverage when she reasonably appeared to be under 26 years of age. The second violation is for permitting an employee to mix, sell, or serve alcoholic beverages, or supervise those who do, without a valid service permit. Licensee is Chipotle Mexican Grill, Inc.; Mathew Ells, Montgomery Moran, Neil Flanzraich, Albert Baldocchi, Darlene Friedman, John Charlesworth, Patrick Flynn, and Kimbal Musk, corporate principals.

LEGARIA'S BAR & GRILL, 990 N Pacific Hwy, Ste C, Woodburn; has paid a fine of \$990 for permitting four bottles of distilled spirits to be on the licensed premises that were not purchased from an Oregon retail liquor sales agent. Licensee is Juan Legaria Olivera.

JOLLY GREEN PIRATE, 610 NW Couch, Portland; will pay a fine of \$6,105 and serve a two-day liquor license suspension or serve a 39-day liquor license suspension for two violations. The first violation is for an employee failing to comply with a restriction on the license that required at least one DPSST-certified staff member to be on duty and on the premises Friday and Saturday nights from 10:00 p.m. to close of business, monitoring the outside areas adjacent to the premises at least every 15 minutes, while clearly identified as security staff. The second violation is for an employee drinking on duty. Licensee is Jolly Green Pirate, LLC; Thomas Bryan Hogan, member.

The Commissioners ratified the following stipulated settlements for failing to verify the age of a minor before allowing him or her to buy or be served an alcoholic beverage when he or she reasonably appeared to be under 26 years of age:

HELLO MARKET, 1917 19th Avenue, Forest Grove; will pay a fine of \$1,485 or serve a nine-day liquor license suspension. Licensees are Yuan Lu and Gonghui Zheng.

OSO MARKET & BAR, 726 SE Grand Ave, Portland; will pay a fine of \$1,155 or serve a seven-day liquor license suspension. Licensee is Union House Bottle Shop, LLC; Colin Howard and Holly (Hillary) Johnson, members.

64 OZ., 110 3rd Street, Hood River; will pay a fine of \$1,485 or serve a nine-day liquor license suspension. Licensee is Hank Tank, Inc.; Lorraine Lyons and Rodney Steward, corporate principals.

The Commissioners ratified the following stipulated settlements for permitting employee(s) to mix, sell, or serve alcoholic beverages, or supervise those who do, without a valid alcohol service permit.

ADIT PUBLIC HOUSE, 150 S Oregon Street, Jacksonville; will pay a fine of \$1,485 or serve a nine-day liquor license suspension will pay a fine of \$1,485 or serve a nine-day liquor license suspension. Licensee is JF Guerrero Wines, LLC; John Guerrero, member.

SHAZAAM'S 2, 2441 W Harvard St, Roseburg; will pay a fine of \$1,485 or serve a nine-day liquor license suspension. Licensee is Shazaam's, LLC; William Whitehead and Sandra Whitehead, members.

SMITHFIELDS RESTAURANT & BAR, 36 S 2nd Street, Ashland; will pay a fine of \$1,485 or serve a nine-day liquor license suspension. Licensee is Berkshire Enterprises, LLC; Neil Clooney and Terry Clooney, members.

The five citizen commissioners are the policy-making body of the OLCC. They meet monthly for one or two days to make decisions regarding the regulation of the sale and service of alcoholic beverages in Oregon by administering the state's Liquor Control Act and the regulation of the sale of recreational marijuana in Oregon through the Control, Regulation, and Taxation of Marijuana and Industrial Hemp Act.
