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OLCC Commissioners to Consider Adopting Temporary Rules Regulating Oregon's Recreational Marijuana Industry

Vote will be First Step in Evolving Process

Portland, Oregon – At its regularly scheduled meeting on **Thursday, October 22, 2015**, the Oregon Liquor Control Commission will consider adopting temporary Oregon Administrative Rules regulating the recreational marijuana industry.

Preceding their deliberations the Commissioners will receive a report from Chris Lyons, chair of the Rules Advisory Committee (RAC), on the RAC's recommendations. The RAC, and its subcommittees, held 38 meetings since June 2015 to develop the rules. The committees included marijuana industry representatives, law enforcers, and community stakeholders. The Commissioners also held a public hearing and had a public comment period to receive feedback on a draft of the proposed rules.

Steve Marks, Executive Director of the OLCC also will provide Commissioners with an overview of the proposed Oregon Administrative Rules, and their implementation.

The meeting will be held from **Thursday, October 22, 2015** from **9:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m.** at OLCC Headquarters, Room 103A, 9079 SE McLoughlin Blvd., Portland, OR 97222.

The capacity limit for the meeting room is 100, with entry granted on a first-come, first-served basis. Overflow seating, limited to 25 people, with audio from the hearing also will be available.

The Commissioners will break for lunch from 11:30 a.m. – 1 p.m.

If necessary, the Commissioners will continue their deliberations on the Temporary Marijuana Rules on **Friday, October 23, 2015** beginning at **9 a.m.**

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
