Come Join the Comprehensive Planning Process for the Oregon State Parks Beltz Property

The Oregon Parks and Recreation Department (OPRD) is initiating the master planning process for the recently acquired Beltz property located in the Sand Lake Estuary, north of Tierra Del Mar and Pacific City. This Master Plan will guide future resource management and recreational uses on this land. OPRD is taking a comprehensive look at natural, scenic area and cultural resource conditions; park management needs; outdoor recreation trends in the region; and community partnerships.

During the planning process, OPRD will hold three sets of public meetings followed by written comment opportunities will ask for input on planning, goals, opportunities and development concepts, and management strategies. Concurrently, OPRD will hold meetings with an advisory stakeholder committee made up of representatives of key interest groups and agencies.

Staff will also present planning concepts with alternatives for development of the park and listen to public comments.

Concept alternatives present different visions for the park and help us consider the specific opportunities and challenges. Public engagement and discussion at this meeting is especially important to the success of the planning effort.

## **Meeting III. Draft Master Plan Review**

**Tentative: March 2016**

At our third series of meetings staff will present the draft master plan for public review before taking the draft plan to the Oregon Parks and Recreation Commission for adoption later that spring.
