

Example Trails of Statewide, Regional and Local Significance in Oregon

(These are examples of the types of non-motorized trails to report on the Trail Connectivity Reporting Forms.)

Statewide Significance (Existing and Proposed)

Statewide Significant Trails are those connecting major destinations such as communities and natural, cultural or historic sites of statewide or national significance. Oregon examples include:

- Pacific Crest National Scenic Trail
- Desert Trail
- The OC&E Woods Line State Trail
- Row River Trail
- Corvallis to the Sea Trail
- The Springwater Corridor (Portland to PCT including 40 Mile Loop)
- The Banks-Vernonia/CZ Logging Road Trail (Banks – Vernonia – Scappose)
- Oregon Coast Trail
- Bear Creek Greenway
- Eugene to Pacific Crest Trail
- North Umqua River Trail

Regional Significance (Existing and Proposed)

Regionally Significant Trails are those connecting regionally significant sites, are multi-jurisdictional, multi-use and that connect to national, state, or other regional trails. Oregon examples include:

- Powerline Trail –Beaverton
- Larkspur Trail – Bend
- East Buttes Loop Trail – Gresham
- Creek to Crest Trail - Ashland
- Astoria River Trail/RiverWalk
- Willow Creek Trail – Madras
- Fanno Creek Trail –Tigard, Beaverton, Portland
- South Fork Walla Walla River Trail – Milton Freewater
- Morrow County Columbia River Heritage Trail – Irrigon
- Ridgeline Trail – Eugene
- Deschutes River Trail – Bend
- Umatilla River Trail – Pendleton
- Clackamas River Trail – Oregon City
- Sara Zigler Trail – Jacksonville
- Dalles Riverfront Trail – The Dalles

Local Significance*

Locally Significant Trails are those making important community connections to local destinations (within the community boundary) such as public lands, parks, town centers, neighborhoods and schools. For trails of Local Significance, please record a limited number of your key "user significant" trails ("high-use" trails providing the greatest benefit to the public). Oregon examples include:

- Powder River Trail – Baker
- Council Creek Trail – Tualatin
- Orenco Creek Trail – Hillsboro
- Oak Creek Trail – Albany
- Trails of the Jacksonville Woodlands
- Hillside Trail – Lakeview
