Oregon CRIMEVue Database Replacement Update

The Oregon State Police is in the process of replacing the current LEDS database and message switch systems, collectively known as CRIMEvue. This extensive project will impact every LEDS agency and user in some way. With that in mind, the CJIS Training Unit recently requested input from the LEDS community in the form of an online survey. As stated in the survey, the goal is to solicit as much input and feedback from the LEDS community as possible regarding desired features and functionality of the new system.

Currently, the project is well underway as executive sponsorship, steering committee members, coordination group participants, and project team

member roles have all been identified. Preliminary planning meetings have already begun as the project moves toward the next major steps: gathering current and future system state information with a goal of releasing a Request for Proposal to vendors in Spring 2016.

Universal Control Number (UCN) Transition

In the past, the FBI Interstate Identification Index (III) has used FBI numbers (FNU)s to index a subject's criminal history record. Under the NGI (Next Generation Identification) and as of June 2015, subjects will be indexed using fingerprint-based identities and will be referenced via a FBI Universal Control Number (FBI UCN).

The most significant difference is that the existence of an FBI UCN is not indicative that the subject being queried has a criminal history. It simply means the individual has an identity in the NGI system.

The FBI UCN will be compatible with, but distinguishable from, an FNU. If an identity currently has an FBI number, the FBI number will be used as the FBI UCN. Universal Control Numbers will be the same length and have the same general structure as FBI numbers (up to 9 alphanumeric characters).

-The LEDS database was recently updated to allow users to query the new UCNs and address any compatibility issues that may have been experienced with certain transactions.

HB 2776 — Emergency Protection Orders

HB 2776, which goes into effect 1 January 2016, grants peace officers in Oregon the ability to apply to the circuit court for an ex parte protection order on behalf of a person in danger of abuse. Information and resources related to Emergency Protection Orders and their entry into LEDS have been distributed to law enforcement LEDS Reps statewide, as well as posted to the LEDS secure website. LEDS Recertification—A Reminder & Tips:

Every LEDS certified employee has 2 years to complete the LEDS recertification process. CJIS Training would rather have an employee recertify 3-6 months early as opposed to going on planned leave and needing an extension. CJIS Training has had many agencies express issues receiving the automatically generated NexTest courtesy notifications alerting them to users recertification needs, this can be remediated by setting alerts to notify you of upcoming recertification dates. You can easily view all LEDS training records active for your agency by completing a QTR LEDS transaction, listing by employees by employing agency and comparing this list to the reports you may pull from the NexTEST Reports function. **The notification emails sent by the NexTest program are considered a courtesy and should not be relied upon as your sole reminder to recertify your LEDS employees.**

A few things to remember:

- NexTest and LEDS DO NOT talk to each other. The LEDS Training records need to be updated manually to reflect the recertification testing dates. This is completed by completing an Enter Training History (ETH) transaction, which is covered in 3.11.3 of the LEDS Rep. Manual. The proper level for LEDS recertification training history entry is "R." Only one "Enter Training History" (ETH) should be entered for recertification tracking with the disposition of complete ("C") – you do not need to enter both Issued and Completed dates for recertification activity.
- The NexTest username and password are case sensitive. The username is the user's Driver's License number and the password is default-set to your agency's ORI, which contains both zeroes and the capital letter "O."
- DPSST is now only tracking F6 credit for sworn users - you must submit your own F6 forms to DPSST for any LEDS Training credit. The DPSST course number for the LEDS

recertification is 15-0716 (if completed in 2015) or 16-0716 (if completed in 2016). [Here is a link to the DPSST F6 form.](#)

- To list the LEDS training record expiration dates for all users for your agency, you can complete a QTR by employing agency (for ForSeCom users) or a QTR by ORI (for WebLEDS users). A LEDS certification is valid for two years; if the last date of training activity listed is 01/07/2012 – this user's certification expiration date is 01/07/2014.
- You may login to NexTEST as an "Agency Login," select the "Reports" function, and select "Expiration Report" by "All Dates in Data Base." This report can be compared to your LEDS Training responses to ensure all recertification testing activity has been entered as needed.

Change to DMV Driving Records — IID Requirement —

Beginning 1 January 2016, the Oregon DMV will update Driver License record formatting to make it easier for law enforcement officers to determine when a driver is subject to an Ignition Interlock Device (IID) requirement.

If a driver is required to have an IID, **IID REQUIRED: YES** will be listed in the ******STATUS ON [DATE]****** section near the top of the driver license information (see example, right).

If the driver is not subject to an IID requirement, the field will not appear; there will be no change to the driver record formatting.
