OREGON CRIME REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

The Oregon Uniform Crime Reporting program was established by authority of ORS 181.550, enacted by the 1973 Oregon legislature. This statute requires all law enforcement agencies to report crime statistics. The statute reads:

181.550 Reporting of crime statistics.

- (1) All law enforcement agencies shall report to the Department of State Police statistics concerning crimes:
 - (a) As directed by the department, for purposes of the Uniform Crime Reporting System of the Federal Bureau of Investigation.
 - (b) As otherwise directed by the Governor concerning general criminal categories of criminal activities but not individual criminal records.
 - (c) Motivated by prejudice based on the perceived race, color, religion, national origin, sexual orientation, marital status, political affiliation or beliefs, membership or activity in or on behalf of a labor organization or against a labor organization, physical or mental disability, age, economic or social status or citizenship of the victim.
 - (d) And other incidents arising out of domestic disturbances under ORS 133.055 (2) and 133.310 (3).
- (2) The department shall prepare:
 - (a) Quarterly and annual reports for the use of agencies reporting under subsection (1) of this section, and others having an interest therein;
 - (b) An annual public report of the statistics on the incidence of crime motivated by prejudice based on the perceived race, color, religion, national origin, sexual orientation, marital status, political affiliation or beliefs, membership or activity in or on behalf of a labor organization or against a labor organization, physical or mental disability, age, economic or social status or citizenship of the victim;
 - (c) Quarterly and annual reports of the statistics on the incidence of crimes and incidents of domestic disturbances; and
 - (d) Special reports as directed by the Governor. [1973 c.130 §2; 1989 c.1028 §1; 1991 c.552 §1; 1993 c.188 §11; 2007 c.70 §46]

DEVELOPMENT and COLLECTION OF DATA

Reports were developed based on data submitted from agencies across the State of Oregon. Law enforcement agencies submit their statistical information in one of two formats:

- Summary based reporting system: Oregon Uniform Crime Reporting, (OUCR)
- Incident based reporting: Oregon National Incident Based Reporting System (ONIBRS).

Data has been provided by OUCR and ONIBRS reporting agencies throughout the year; that data was utilized to compile this annual report. Please reference the Agency Reporting chart detailing the reporting format for each agency such as OUCR, ONIBRS, or both OUCR and ONIBRS, along with noting each month an individual agency reported data for the 2014 Calendar year.

The 2014 reports contain extracts from both OUCR and ONIBRS. Data from OUCR and ONIBRS are not a one to one comparison because of the different nature in their methodologies. Agencies submitting data utilizing the incident based format, ONIBRS, are providing a more comprehensive depiction than the data captured by the OUCR categories.

The data included throughout this report may vary slightly due to the timeframe in which the numbers were collected. Agencies have the ability to submit updated numbers throughout the year based on newly developed offense or arrest information.

The Oregon State Police would like to acknowledge and recognize participating Oregon law enforcement agencies for their dedication to the Oregon Uniform Crime reporting program. Without their efforts to provide crime data, this report would not be possible.

The Oregon Uniform Crime Reporting (OUCR) Program presents information in offense and arrest groupings of **Crimes Against Persons**, **Crimes Against Property**, and **Behavioral Crimes**.

The three groups are described below in the order in which they appear in this report with offenses listed in order of severity:

Crimes Against Persons: Criminal offenses where the victim is present and the act is violent, threatening, or has the potential of being physically harmful.

ADDITIONAL DATA AND SUPPLEMENTAL REPORTS

In addition to presenting information in offense and arrest groupings, the OUCR Program presents additional data for **Traffic Crime, Fish and Game, Marine Violations, Law Enforcement Officers Killed and Assaulted (LEOKA),** and an **Agency Offense and Arrest Summary.** Sections providing supplemental report information include the **Law Enforcement Employee Count, Domestic Violence, and Bias Reports.**

The additional data and supplemental reports are described below in the order in which they appear in the 2014 annual report:

Index Crimes: A statewide summary of the 8 crimes determined by the FBI to make up the Crime Index. The Crime Index is intended as a means of measuring and comparing crime from state to state on a national level.

Regulatory Offenses and Arrests: Traffic Crime, Fish and Game, and Marine Violations: A statewide summary of Regulatory crimes showing the number of persons arrested for each offense by age classification (adult or juvenile) and gender.

Statewide Offense and Arrest Summary: A statewide summary on the number of persons arrested for each offense by age classification (adult or juvenile) and gender.

Law Enforcement Officers Killed and Assaulted (LEOKA): The LEOKA Report provides detailed statewide information on Oregon officers killed and assaulted in the line of duty, the circumstances surrounding the incidents, type of assignments, and weapons used. This report provides detailed supplemental information that will be shown separately however the offense and arrest data associated with these crimes has been included in crime totals for the offense and arrest groupings listed above.

Law Enforcement Employee Count: This is supplemental information that will be shown separately. The report provides information on full-time Law Enforcement employees, male and female, sworn and non-sworn on the payroll as of October 31, 2014 for each law enforcement agency.

Agency Offense and Arrest Summary: The Offense and Arrest Summary by Agency Report provides detailed information for individual Law Enforcement Agencies on offenses and arrests reported for categories of; Crimes Against Persons, Crimes Against Property, Behavioral Crimes, Traffic Crimes, Fish and Game Laws, Marine Violations and totals for Index Crimes. This report provides detailed supplemental information that will be shown separately however the offense and arrest data associated with these crimes has been included in crime totals for the statewide offense and arrest groupings.

Domestic Violence and Bias Reporting: This report provides detailed supplemental information that will be shown separately however the offense and arrest data associated with these crimes has been included in crime totals for the offense and arrest groupings listed above.

Note on Population data:

The Annual Oregon Uniform Crime report does not provide an analysis of crime across the state; annual crime statistics are provided based on reported crime data.

Jurisdictional population data is not reported to the OUCR Program therefore it has not been included throughout this report. Use caution when comparing crime statistics between county or city agencies, in order to establish a comparable basis, population must be taken into consideration. Note on definitions of Offenses and Arrests:

- The term “Offenses,” as used in this report for crime reporting purposes, is defined as “known criminal acts occurring within the reporting agency’s jurisdiction.” The reported offense counts are generated from receipt of a complaint or call for service. All reports of thefts and attempted thefts are included, regardless of the value of property involved.

Any law enforcement agency discovering, receiving a report, or investigating any offense occurring in its jurisdiction that would constitute a crime shall report these facts to the Oregon Uniform Crime Reporting (OUCR) monthly.

- The term “Arrest,” as used in this report for crime reporting purposes, may be defined as one or more of the following:
 1. The physical arrest of a person, adult or juvenile, held in jail, detention facility, or detained pending bail, hearing trial, etc.
 2. The issuance of a citation for a criminal offense. (A citation is issued for the person, adult or juvenile, to appear at a later date for felony, misdemeanor, or criminal violation charges, in lieu of being taken immediately into custody).
 3. The issuance of a traffic citation for appropriate traffic arrests listed in the OUCR manual.
 4. Persons, adult or juvenile, summoned or notified to appear in a court of law to answer criminal charges.
 5. Juveniles processed by police for criminal offenses and then released to parents, relatives, or guardians with no further action planned.

Any law enforcement agency arresting, citing or issuing a summons to any person (adult or juvenile) for any crime which occurred in its jurisdiction shall report these facts to OUCR monthly.
