Please note: all vehicles responding to a conflagration should be improved/unpaved road capable.

Sending Resources

1. AOC contacts Fire Defense Board Chief (FDBC) to relay resource request.
2. FDBC reviews resource inventory to determine assignments:
 - a. Appoint Strike Team/Task Force Leader
 - b. Identify which units will respond
 - c. Specify Point of Departure (POD) for Strike Team/Task Force
3. Report back to AOC within 20 minutes that either:
 - a. Request can be filled as specified

or

 - b. Request cannot be filled
4. If AOC accepts resource order, Task Force/Strike Team Form must be submitted to AOC. All forms can be found online at:
http://www.oregon.gov/osp/SFM/Pages/Oregon_Mob_Plan.aspx under Task Force/Strike Team Information.
5. AOC will advise FDBC if/when authorized to mobilize. AOC will provide incident and check-in details.
6. Before leaving POD, Strike Team/Task Force Leader must:
 - a. Ensure each apparatus completes FSP-01
 - b. Ensure all personnel and apparatus are properly equipped to respond for a minimum of 3 days
7. Strike Team/Task Force Leader must inform AOC of departure time.

Note:

- All resources must be covered by the department/ jurisdiction's workers' compensation policy.
- Resources are expected to mobilize within 1.5 hours of initial AOC contact.

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
