Start Safe recognizes home fire safety as an adult responsibility. Reaching parents and caregivers is critical so that changes can be made in the home. Start Safe has been specifically designed to help teachers and fire educators to reach parent and caregivers with key safety messages and help them take action to reduce the risk of fires and burns at home. The program also provides tools to deliver effective fire education to children ages 3-6 years.

The Office of State Fire Marshal's Youth Fire Prevention and Intervention Program, in partnership with the Home Safety Council and Safe Kids Oregon, are providing Start Safe kits and training to fire agencies and preschool programs throughout the state at no cost.

A limited number of smoke alarms are available at no cost for families in participating program. Key features of the curriculum include:

- 16-page user's guide for teachers & fire and life safety educators
- Bilingual poster story (Big Book) & 28 mini versions
- Instructional and Lending Library DVDs
- Bilingual fire and burn safety booklets for parents

More than 500 members of the Oregon's fire service and Head Start programs representing 16 communities have participated in the 8 Start Safe trainings conducted to date. Head Start Programs unable to participate during the 2010-2011 school year have begun to schedule trainings for the fall. Trainings have already been scheduled for September and October in the following communities:

- Roseburg
- OSU-Corvallis
- Beach/Medford
