Meeting Notes:

1. Welcome- Craig Roberts
 - Officially opened the Meeting
 - Introductions
 - Unable to approve last meeting minutes due to not having a quorum

2. I Love You Guys- John Michael Keyes
 - Peggy introduced Lisa Freiley from PACE
 - Lisa gave an overview of what PACE is.
 - Peggy introduced John Michael Keyes

 - Spoke about Safe2Tell tip line and having it legislatively mandated anonymity. Statewide is very important also for tracking. Web tips number one, text tips are number two and phone calls are number three.

3. RFI Update- David Alamein, Linda Anderson and Nolan Campbell
 - Linda Anderson talked about the RFI and how to move forward
 - We have developed a statement of work to get a contractor to look to write the RFI.
 - Cy Smith has shared information about a new software option Pictometry can bring information into the Raptor and they are working on some details at no cost.

- We can add the standardization of the language into the RFI.
 - When we get this contractor on board we will need to know how to interact with this group to move the process forward.
4. Subcommittees- Craig Roberts
- Erik Gabliks was chosen as the subcommittee chair for the Terminology subcommittee. A conference call for November 4th has been set up
 - Goal is to determine real fundamental language between schools, law enforcement and the community.
 - Basic, Consistent, real
5. Presentation feedback:
- The I Love You Guys is very specific and sometimes doesn't work within certain districts.
 - An MOU has to be signed to use the I Love You Guys which doesn't allow the customization.
 - Some specifics for Lincoln County School Districts are: Lockout procedure allows movement throughout the building. Procedures to not lock exterior doors on lockdowns isn't acceptable for all schools.
 - i. Question: Has anyone asked John Michael about modifying his model for Oregon?
 - ii. Peggy will start a discussion with him regarding modifying his model for Oregon.
 - Susan will be sending the email around the MOU language and the ability to modify.
 - Dave talked about Lincoln County being a leader in this process, but we also should be looking at providing something for the other districts. So many districts do not have the resources to even start something let alone develop an entire program.
 - When talking about "locally" when talking about law enforcement we really are talking about a county and about 3-4 surrounding counties.
 - One shoe is not going to fit all, but if we can get something that is middle of the road.
 - Major Bloom asked the question to Marysville PD about last Friday's school shooting, if the Rapid Responder system was utilized and to what success or failure. We are hoping to have an answer before the next meeting.

- One of the biggest challenges is money. Sheriff Roberts has been talking to private industries as well as reaching out to Rapid Responder. They would like to do a pilot project of 50-100 schools at no cost or permanent commitment to the process.
- If can't do a pilot project, the state system doesn't allow for this. Major Bloom talked about letting this RFI process work. We are hoping by next spring we might be able to have a start.
 - i. Question: Can we do the pilot outside of the state system?
 - ii. Answer: If that would be the case OSP, ODE would have to completely opt out of the process. An aggressive vendor could still through up some roadblocks down the line.
 - iii. We need to be thinking about a procurement strategy. Work with DAS to develop this. Look at possible outcomes and see if there is a way to get where we would like to go and how we can get there quicker.
- Could we start other work ahead of time? Could we build teams to start conversations about where are the command posts going to be, gathering school specific information (maps, pictures, etc.), and starting communications with local law enforcement.
- One of the things we could do is start pulling law enforcement and educators together to ask the questions around county specific needs.
- This would also help deescalate some of the fears of a statewide program.
- Bring in large and small districts together to help work out what we really need and what is acceptable (bare minimum) on what we have to have.
- Suggestion about having something in the East County Portland area to help the community heal and have a voice.
- Mitch suggested we put together the framework but leaves the local flexibility; however the common language is essential.
- Suggestion to put together a subcommittee around assisting building a framework?

6. Next Steps

- Newsletter came out; we will have another one soon.
- An upcoming meeting we could have a Lines for Life presentation

- Oregon had a statewide hotline... we need to do some research around where it went and why it is not in use. Susan and Mitch to look into it (8-10 years ago) Marketing was done at the statewide level.
- Funding will be a 10 year contract at least. But what happens with it after that 10 year. Who owns the mapping project?
- Major Bloom is going to follow up Washington State details
- List of concerns from I Love you Guys as well as Oregon Hotline
- Create a group around have to have- Start at this level then take it to a subcommittee (database system) mapping objective of House Bill. Noland and Linda can be part of this group to help drive this group. Most of this information will need to be coming from the Education side.
