RULE SUMMARY

These amendments implement legislation passed in 2009 (Ch 250, OL 2009) and permit a qualified pharmacist to administer a vaccine to a person who is at least 11 years of age. Amendments also change the reporting requirements in accordance with protocols written and approved by the Oregon Health Authority.

A public rulemaking hearing may be requested in writing by 10 or more people, or by an association with 10 or more members, within 21 days following the publication of the Notice of Proposed Rulemaking in the *Oregon Bulletin* or 28 days from the date Notice was sent to people on the agency mailing list, whichever is later. If sufficient hearing requests are received, the notice of the date and time of the rulemaking hearing must be published in the *Oregon Bulletin* at least 14 days before the hearing.

The agency requests public comment on whether other options should be considered for achieving the rule's substantive goals while reducing the negative economic impact of the rule on business.

Fiscal and Economic Impact, including Statement of Cost of Compliance:

There are no additional costs to state agencies, units of local government or members of the public. These amendments make minor changes in record-keeping and reporting requirements and there maybe increased administrative costs to pharmacies that choose to offer vaccinations, however that cost cannot be determined.

There may be additional training costs to pharmacists who choose to become qualified to administer vaccinations. There are approximately 275 community pharmacies that may be "Small Businesses" that may need to modify their record-keeping systems if they wish to offer vaccinations, however there is no requirement to offer vaccinations.
