



The OCFW testified on **23 bills** and other policy support in Long and Short sessions including our own bill

HB 2226: DV Survivor Name Change Anonymity



+ 91% of the bills we backed passed

2013 Session and 2014 Session

8 Education bills including:

SB 755: Minority Teachers Act. Passed

HB 4084: Community Colleges to Provide Child Daycare.

8 Justice Safety and Policing bills including

HB 4086, Exempt personal info from transit data. Passed

HB 2226: DV Survivor Name Change Anonymity. Passed

1 Jobs and the Economy bill:

SB 744: Pay Equity Study. OCFW Testimony. Passed.

6 Health/Healthcare bills including

SB 1542, Home Care Registry. Passed.

HB 2661: Culturally Competent Care. Passed.




+ 2013 – 17 Priorities
